The number of Black people admitted to the hospital with psychotic disorders and marijuana use/intoxication diagnoses was similar to the number of White people with these diagnoses, although in Connecticut, the percentage of Black residents is 13% and the percentage of White residents is 81%. This result indicates that the rate of hospital admissions for these comorbid conditions is higher for Black people than White people.
