September 2019 is Newborn Screening Awareness Month

The Connecticut Department of Public Health recognizes September as Newborn Screening Awareness Month

Did you know?

- Nearly 4 million babies receive Newborn Screening (NBS) every year. Last year in Connecticut over 36,000 babies (> 99% of all babies born in CT) received at least one NBS test.
- Newborn screening (NBS) has three parts:

SA blood test (heel-stick screen):

A hearing test

A test for certain types of heart problems (pulse oximetry screen)

- Newborn Screening is a state public health service that screens babies for serious but treatable medical conditions.
- More than 1 in 300 newborns have a treatable condition that can be picked up by NBS

• Newborn Screening in Connecticut started in 1964 and tested for one condition (PKU), now we can pick up over 60 different conditions.
