Meeting Minutes

Introductions

- Introductions of members who were not present at the previous meeting
- Approval of the minutes from the first meeting – Michael Holmes made a motion, and Barbara Cass seconded the motion

Discussion of Mission Statement

- Chris briefly recapped the mission statement
- Craig Mittleman asked if it would be helpful to consolidate the last statement by using the word “access” to care
 - Chris tabled the approval and asked Craig to draft his edits, will return to this later

Discussion of Data and Measurements

- Co-chairs have been working both with DPH and with CHA to get data on emergency department beds
 - Barbara Cass gave an update on the data that DPH does and does not collect relating to emergency departments
 - She recommended connecting further with CHA
- Craig asked about length of stay in emergency departments, but boarding definition may be different
 - Most places have boarding data – is this provided to CHA?
- Dock Fox plans to reach out to a Laura Fox for national data on emergency nursing to see what is missing in Connecticut
- Michael: we may have to do a survey with this group to collect our own data
- What electronic health record services are doctors using?
 - EPIC, Cerner
- John Brancato: on a definition standpoint, we need to have more uniform definitions, so we have a better picture of the burden

- Lara suggested that the group separate psychiatric patients from other EDs, as not to skew results
- Using the time stamp of the admission order is fairly uniform, also consider time until the decision is made – potentially having a parallel measure for total length of stay
- Trying to avoid unintended consequences of boarding measures
- Johnathan Bankoff – his decision to admit is an earlier one
- Craig – worried about a huge variability between systems when it comes to measurement
- Anumeha Singh – regardless of gaming the system, total length of stay and the decision to admit a patient are both consistent
- Craig – brought up the ED benchmarking alliance (has data for over 2,000 EDs), might be a good source to compare to for definitions
- How do we best make this data accessible to the public?
- Jennifer: perhaps we could incorporate this data into a future report?

Brainstorming Issue Areas to Focus On

- Chris' flow chart of areas that the group may look at and intervene on
- Rebekah: Even the definition of treatment space is not consistent across states
- Susan Halpin – in the diagram, she was looking for reference to the new urgent crisis centers esp wrt with behavioral health
 - One of their missions was to provide relief to the emergency rooms
 - The UCCs are generally only accessible until age 18, but still worth including that on the chat
- Sue - Discussion of working with the ambulance providers to direct people to certain facilities, rather than the emergency room
- Barbara: Problem we need to really focus on is how do we get to the ED issues and get those numbers down
- Rebekah: CMS has retired some measures, but there will be a national data tool opening by CMS in the coming weeks
- Barbara – did the group want to make a recommendation for a public dashboard
 - Dr. Mittleman worries that this data could disadvantage certain hospitals, and wants to be cautious
 - Dock – is there a way for hospitals to submit data anonymously?
 - Jennifer – the average length of stay was just published, it allows leaders to see where they sit in comparison

Discussion of Subgroups and Working Group Structure

- Chris shared screen with Michael's org chart, containing potential subgroups:
- Committee on quality measures, chairs Chris Moore and Rebekah Heckman
 - Who is willing to serve on this sub committee alongside Chris and Rebekah
- Discharge Units
 - Jonathan Bankoff is willing to help (but did not volunteer to chair)
 - Discussion of ED discharge versus in-patient discharge – Daniel Freess believes this is a mistake

- Evaluation of % who are held in the ED after being admitted to hospital
 - No chair(s) yet
- Reduction in liability for hospitals/EDs
 - No chair(s) yet
