- The respondents are public agencies.
- 2. On May 13, 1976, at a regular meeting of the respondent Board of Education, complainant presented to respondent board a petition signed by 368 people asking respondent board to withdraw from a Regional organization known as the "Central Office Committee."
- 3. The petition was placed on the agenda for the June 10. 1976 meeting of the Board.
- 4. Subsequent to the May 13, 1976 meeting, the chairman of the respondent board telephoned some signers of this petition.
- 5. On or about May 24, 1976, the chairman telephoned other board members to ask them to assist him in calling petitioners.
- 6. The chairman says his purpose in calling petitioners was to inquire into their reasons for signing the petition.
- 7. The action of the chairman of the respondent board in calling a quorum of board members constituted a telephonic meeting as defined in Section 1(b) of P.A. 75-342.

ORDER

- 1. Because there is insufficient evidence to show that the telephonic meeting resulted in substantive action this complaint is dismissed.
- 2. The Commission advises that a telephonic meeting, to which some board members and the public are denied access, opens a gray area in which tentative decisions or other substantive actions become possible. It is preferable that all such business be conducted at a regular or special meeting, in full view of all board members and the public, in conformity with the purposes of P.A. 75-342.
