The above captioned matter was heard as a contested case on June 6, 1984 at which time the complainants and the respondents appeared and presented testimony, exhibits and argument on the complaint.

After consideration of the entire record the following facts are found:

- 1. The respondent is a public agency within the meaning of §1-18a(a), G.S.
- 2. By letter dated April 26, 1984 the complainants made a request of the respondent superintendent for access to inspect and copy minutes of an April 23, 1984 executive session of the respondent board.
- 3. By letter dated May 1, 1984 the respondent superintendent indicated to the complainants that the respondent board had not held an executive session on April 26, 1984.
- 4. By letter of complaint filed with the Commission on May 9. 1984 the complainants appealed the denial of their request.
- 5. It is found that no executive session was held by the respondent board on April 23, 1984.
- 6. It is concluded that the respondents did not violate §§1-15 or 1-19(a), G.S. when they denied the complaints' April 26, 1984 request.

The following order by the Commission is hereby recommended on the basis of the record concerning the above captioned complaint.

1. The complaint is hereby dismissed.
