AMENDMENTS

Paragraph 19 of the Hearing Officer's Report is amended as follows:

19. However, such circumstances are not found in this case. As a threshold matter, IC-2018-0089-1 [and -2] **through IC-2018-0089-3** do not reflect communication with an outside technical expert retained specifically to assist the attorney in rendering legal advice. It is found, therefore, that the communication with the third-party was not made in confidence.
