Jan M. Gawlik v. Angel Quiros, Commissioner, State of Connecticut, Department of Correction; and State of Connecticut, Department of Correction

The order in the Hearing Officer's Report is amended as follows:

14. At the hearing in this matter, Counselor Supervisor and FOI Administrator Anthony Campanelli credibly testified that disclosure of the records responsive to the request in paragraph 2, above, [would] <u>may</u> result in a safety risk within a correctional facility, including risk of escape, because such records include information about the facility's emergency procedures, including information about lockdowns and modified lockdowns; whether units are open, closed, on a lockdown or modified lockdown; how an area within a facility is secured; and staff assignment, reassignment, and staff location.
