## **AMENDMENTS**

Docket #FIC 2022-0290 William Bellock v. Commissioner, State of Connecticut,

Paragraph 16 of the Hearing Officer's Report is amended as follows:

16. With regard to the respondents' claim that certain portions of the in camera records are exempt from disclosure pursuant to § 1-210(b)(10), G.S., that statute permits a public agency to withhold from disclosure records of "communications privileged by the attorney-client [privilege] **RELATIONSHIP.**
