Attorney Kevin W. Munn and Executive Director Colleen M. Murphy reported that the Superior Court dismissed *Connecticut State Police Union, Inc v. Connecticut Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection et al.*, Docket No. MMX-CV23-5016232-S. The Commission was an intervenor in the case and had argued for dismissal on the ground that the Commission had primary jurisdiction over the matter pending in Court. The Commissioners took no action.

Executive Director Colleen M. Murphy reported that the Commission had four open positions that it would soon be hiring for: a paralegal, an administrative assistant and two staff attorneys.
