Attorney Mary-Kate Smith reported that Superior Court Judge Henry Cohn granted the Commission's motion to dismiss in *Chief, Police Department, City of New London et al. v. Freedom of Information Commission*, HHB-CV23-6079961-S, an appeal of the Commission's final decision in FIC-2022-0176.

Executive Director Colleen M. Murphy reported that Attorney Jennifer F. Miller would represent the Commission in oral arguments that were scheduled for Thursday, October 19, 2023, in the Appellate Court in *Town of Avon et al. v. Joseph Sastre et al.*, an appeal of a Superior Court decision that upheld the Commission's final decision in Docket # FIC-2020-0133, *Joseph Sastre v. Brandon Robertson, Town Manager, Town of Avon et al.*

Executive Director Colleen M. Murphy reported that Judy Ganswindt had been appointed to the Freedom of Information Commission and would be officially joining the Commission at its October 25, 2023 meeting.
