Convening Authority

Pursuant to Section 8 of <u>Public Act 25-16</u>, the State Long-Term Care Ombudsman, in conjunction with the Commissioners of Public Health and Social Services, convened the first meeting of the Residential Care Home Evacuation & Mutual Aid Digital Platform Workgroup.

Statutory Charge of the Workgroup

The group is tasked with examining:

- 1. Residential care home evacuation procedures.
- 2. Whether to require residential care homes to participate in a mutual aid digital platform that supports the risk management needs of health care organizations, including dedicated solutions for emergency management, inspection, testing and maintenance management, inspections management and health care coalition management.

A final report, including findings and recommendations, must be submitted to the General Assembly's Human Services, Public Health, and Aging Committees no later than **January 1, 2026**.

Meeting Proceedings

- **Opening Remarks**: The Ombudsman welcomed attendees, reviewed the statutory mandate, and outlined expectations for the workgroup's timeline.
- **Introductions**: Each member introduced themselves and shared their perspective on evacuation and emergency preparedness in residential care homes.
- Discussion Item 1 Evacuation Procedures:
 - Overview of current regulatory requirements and practices for nursing homes vs residential care homes.
 - Identification of strengths and gaps in evacuation planning, training, and coordination between settings.
 - Strengths Include:
 - DSS/DPH/DHMAS/LTCOP Continues to Support Homes and continue to hold Multi-Agency Training Sessions to support best practices and help homes address issues before they become emergencies or face closure.
 - Gaps Include:
 - No Requirement of Insurance for catastrophic Issues
 - Currently there is no ability for RCH's to Shelter residents during evacuations without a full discharge causing disruptions to continuity of care and increased administrative burden
 - Due to increased administrative burden and no ability to "shelter" many residential care homes have expressed concerns about admitting individuals sight unseen during evacuations due to historical challenges
 - Medication Transportation Challenges
 - Limited regulatory requirements in place for guidance for Natural Disaster Plans and Emergencies
 - How increasingly Evacuations and Emergencies are tied to Closures
 - Some Residential Care Homes are HCBS Approved VIA DSS but some are not.
 - There is no Universal Mechanism to Notify the Greater CT Residential Care Homes that an Emergency is taking place.
 - Barriers During Evacuations Include:

 Ensuring Resident Access to Medical and Mental Health Providers

o Consideration of lessons learned from recent evacuations/closures.

• Discussion Item 2 – Mutual Aid Digital Platform:

 Consideration and Coordination of a future presentation of potential platforms such as Jenson Hughes - Mutual Aid Plan that could support emergency management and inspections.

 Discussion of feasibility, cost, implementation challenges, and benefits for residential care homes.

Next Steps:

- o Confirm best practices and collect existing evacuation plans and policies for review.
- Request availability for presentation on nursing home mutual aid platforms currently in use.

Action Items

- Ombudsman's Office to circulate statutory language and reporting requirements.
- DPH to provide data on prior residential care home closures.
- DSS to confirm context on funding or Medicaid-related considerations.
- Residential Care Home representatives to reach out to members to discuss from their perspectives challenges/success and examples of current evacuation protocols.
- Next meeting to be scheduled in October 2025.

Statutory Establishment

Public Act 25-16

Sec. 8. (Effective from passage) The State Ombudsman, in conjunction with the Commissioners of Public Health and Social Services, shall convene a working group to examine (1) residential care home evacuation procedures, and (2) whether to require residential care homes to participate in a mutual aid digital platform that supports the risk management needs of health care organizations, including dedicated solutions for emergency management, inspection, testing and maintenance management, inspections management and health care coalition management. The working group shall include not less than two representatives of residential care homes. Not later than January 1, 2026, the working group shall submit a report, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, to the joint standing committees of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to human services, public health and aging regarding the findings and recommendations of the working group.
