Minutes

A motion was made to approve the September, minutes by Steven Rogers, as they are. A second to the motion was made by Brett Salafia.

Virtual Packet

CFRP Data-

There were seven fatalities reported by the OCME to date for the month of October. The causes varied there were GSW homicides, suicide, and some unsafe sleep with one possible medical case that are all pending further studies. There were a few cases from earlier in the year that have been signed out, most have been ruled to be natural in manner. One case was determined to have been caused by a therapeutic complication. There was a recent uptick in suicides over the past week, there was a 17-year-old and 4 young adults ages 18-24. A review of 2022 data indicated that there were more accidental deaths in 2022 than in previous years and that males die via this manner up to 3 times more than females.

Discussion-

Suicide ages were discussed, lethal means are predominantly items used for hanging in this state with firearms being the secondary cause. Recently there was a massive recall of Gun safes, which happened after 39 unauthorized users accessing firearms from locked safes and one child death. Several questions were raised as per the MVA accidents with regards to how cars were accessed, times and dates of accidents and overall licensure of these teens. Panel members discussed the graduated license program and if it was still in effect. At this time panel members would like to revisit adolescent deaths and have requested it become a future agenda item.

Infant Toddler Summit 12/13/23 -

An opportunity to revisit with multiple stakeholders, to fortify prevention efforts and explore other avenues for information collection and sharing. There will presentations by subject experts. Full zoom option is being explored. Panel members were asked to send presenter information to Brendan Burke who is organizing the event.

Liam R. Report released 10/23/23-

A general summary of the report was provided by Sarah Eagan. Recommendations from report were also discussed.

Discussion-

Agencies involved with the family discussed their contacts with Liam's family and discussed gaps in services provided. Accountability for all agencies/providers involved was discussed to collectively prevent these tragic case results. DCF offered a walkthrough of the case practice for this family in real time.

Participant/ Member Updates-

Commission on Gun Violence will have a report coming out at the end of the year. OCA remains active with ADPC and continues to put forth recommendations about a 2-generation approach to treatment. Currently the CT Opioid Settlement Advisory Committee is requesting public feedback on allocation of funds.
