### **CFRP Data-**

July was an active month (12 reported cases) 6 of those deaths were determined to be Accidental. Accidents continue to be a leading cause for child death in CT, with 29 in 2021, 40 in 2022 and 24 for the current year to date.

### **Dr. Kirsten Bechtel**

- -Cannabis exposure data for youths 19 yrs. and under in CT
- -CT safe packaging laws that that require sellers to limit serving sizes, have clear labeling, child resistant packaging and packaging that does not appear to children.

# <u>Dr. Sam Wang-</u> Pediatric Toxicologist -Children's Hospital Colorado, Presentation: *Ingestions, Adverse Effects of Cannabis in Pediatrics*

- -Half of the states have allowed medical, retail and or recreational cannabis and can distribution.
- -There have emerged different synthesizing methods for cannabis products which have resulted in products with higher concentrations of THC from previous years.
- -In Colorado calls to poison center for marijuana exposure increased drastically from 2009. There has also been an increase in hospitalizations due to ingestions, with some children being hospitalized for 24-48 hours with more severe symptoms.
- -Research is being done on toxic cannabis edible ingestions and prolonged symptoms associated with larger doses.
- -American College of Medical Toxicology recently published packaging guidelines that could prevent accidental ingestions

### Discussion-

Marijuana's effects on unborn children have been shown to cause irreversible injury. Marijuana exposed newborns has been compared to FAS, since it will take years to see the detrimental health impacts. Safe storage principles were discussed, and the possibility of penalties associated with accidental ingestion when THC products were not kept out of reach of children. In Colorado there were media campaigns around safe storage of THC products when legalization occurred. Stake holders wondered if perhaps safe storage is something that can be discussed with legislators. In Colorado they have bars that are dedicated to using THC products which could limit child ingestion. The uptick in wrong way crashes in CT that has coincided with legalization was explored, Colorado has a similar experience with cannabis positive drivers, however tests have not been developed that can accurately gauge when the usage occurred or how it impacted the driver.
