Minutes

A motion was made to approve the June 26,2024, minutes by Pina Violano, as they are. A second to the motion was made by Liz Corley. Kirsten Bechtel abstained.

CFRP Data/Discussion

There have been 6 child fatalities reported to the OCA by the OCME for the month of June. There were two apparent suicides of older adolescents, cause of death for both was asphyxia. Four children are pending further study, there were unsafe sleep components noted for three of those cases. Breakdown of 2024 newly signed out cases were presented to panel members. Lethal means were discussed, there were no firearms suicides reported this month.

Sleep related deaths were explored further, a ten-year case comparison showed that approximately 30% of our child fatalities have been infant deaths with unsafe sleep components noted. Illicit substance exposure deaths were discussed. Homicide classification with regards to ingestion deaths versus accidental was explained. Specific case factors leading to unsafe sleep deaths were looked at using the DASH system. PRAMS room sharing and bedsharing data was mentioned with regards to the ABCs of safe sleep. The criteria for the SIDS death determination have become more stringent resulting in less SIDS determinations. Pacifiers were discussed, as part of safe sleep equipment.

DPH Presentation

Infant Mortality Reivew Program (IMRP), proposed by the Governor in 2023, to be housed in the Department of Public Health to study infant deaths for the overall improvement health disparities as they pertain to maternal care. Program objectives include creating an IMR Committee, determining annual number of infant deaths related to preventable causes, identifying trends to make recommendations and reporting out to stakeholders.

Member Updates / Infant Toddler Report Recommendations

DCF- Creating a practice and policy brief about safe sleep, it will be fashioned after the practice and policy brief created by their national partners the National Partnership for Child Safety. Safety services redesigning IFP and RTFT, continue to work with DMHAS on Fentanyl Senior Advisory group.
