

RESIDENTIAL ELECTRIC CUSTOMERS: IT'S TIME TO REVIEW YOUR SUMMER ELECTRIC GENERATION RATE!

The standard service generation rates that will be effective July 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015 have been announced by The Connecticut Light and Power Company ("CL&P" d/b/a Eversource) and The United Illuminating Company ("UI"). So, now is a good time to review your generation rate choices and decide whether to choose standard generation service from your electric distribution company (CL&P or UI), or generation service provided by an electric supplier company.

For CL&P residential customers, the standard service rate will be **8.228 cents** per kilowatt hour ("kWh").

For UI residential customers not on time-of-use service, the rate will be **9.1241** cents per kWh. For UI time-of-use customers, the standard service rate will be 11.6808 cents per kWh for on-peak usage, and 8.1808 cents per kWh for off-peak usage. Off-peak hours are between 8:00 p.m. and 12:00 noon Monday through Friday, and all weekend long.

When changing your supplier, be aware that your meter reading date and the date when you notify your new supplier affect the date your change will be effective. Be sure to ask the supplier how your meter reading date will affect the date your change is effective.
