

FYI: What is the Corporate Structure of The Electric And Gas Public Utilities In Connecticut?

The three regulated natural gas companies are affiliates of electricity distribution companies (EDCs) in Connecticut. Southern Connecticut Gas Company (SCG) and Connecticut Natural Gas Corporation (CNG) are held by the UIL Holdings Corporation (UIL Holdings), and they are affiliates of the EDC, the United Illuminating Company. Yankee Gas Services Company is held by Northeast Utilities (NU), and is an affiliate of the EDC, the Connecticut Light and Power Company (CL&P).

In addition to providing electricity distribution service, CL&P and UI provide electricity transmission services. For the most part, transmission service is federally regulated.

UIL Holdings and NU hold regulated utility companies in other New England states.

UIL Holdings holds Berkshire Gas Company in Massachusetts. NU holds NStar Electric

Company, NStar Gas Company, and Western Massachusetts Electric Company, all in

Massachusetts. In New Hampshire, NU holds Public Service Company of New Hampshire.

In addition to its New England holdings, UIL has plans to purchase Philadelphia Gas Works in Pennsylvania.
