

## **EBB** is Now the Affordable **Connectivity Program**

Here is what changes in the EBB program mean for you

Starting in 2022, the Emergency Broadband Benefit (EBB) program will transition to a new program called the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP). This means there is now a long-term program to help you afford broadband.

#### I am currently enrolled in the EBB and receive broadband benefits. What do I do now?

- You will be automatically enrolled into the ACP program to continue your benefits.\*
- \*Households that qualified for the EBB because of job loss or furlough since February 29, 2020 or by meeting the eligibility criteria for a participating provider's COVID-19 program will need to reapply after 3/1/22.
- The benefit amount is changing from up to \$50/month to up to \$30 month beginning 3/1/22. For people on tribal lands, the benefit amount will stay the same at \$75 per month.

## Get Help Paying for High-Speed Internet

Sign up by the end of the year to receive full benefits from a free program

As of December 31, 2021, the Emergency Broadband Benefit (EBB) program will transition to a new program called the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP). This means there is now a long-term program to help you afford broadband!

If you could use help paying for internet access, sign up for the EBB now. If you enroll by 12/30/21 you will receive the maximum benefit of up to \$50/month through 3/1/22 and up to \$30/month after that.

To enroll, simply 1) complete an application and get approved and 2) sign up with a company.

#### Do I qualify for the new ACP program?

In 2022, your household may qualify for the ACP benefit if:

- You receive Women, Infants and Children (WIC) supplemental nutrition benefits.
- You participate in free and reduced school meals or Pell grant programs.
- You receive supplemental social security (SSI), Medicaid, Federal Public Housing Assistance (FPHA), SNAP, or Veterans Pension and Survivor Benefits.
- You met EBB eligibility criteria or qualify for Lifeline benefits.
