Testimony of the Office of Chief Public Defender TaShun Bowden- Lewis, Chief Public Defender

Judiciary Committee – March 22, 2023 Raised S.B. 1230 – An Act Expanding Access to Public Defender Services

The Office of Chief Public Defender (OCPD) <u>whole heartedly supports</u> the intent of **Raised S.B. 1230 An Act Expanding Access to Public Defender Services.** However, it is important to note that if this bill is adopted, additional funding and resources will be needed to hire additional personnel for the Division of Public Defender Services (DPDS).

There is no question that the indigent, the underserved, and those stricken by poverty deserve the legal services of zealous and competent advocates. DPDS is comprised of attorneys, social workers, investigators, and clerical staff. The clients represented by this agency require full staffing and resources to represent them with excellence and integrity.

The Sixth Amendment to the United States Constitution "guarantees" the right to counsel. In <u>Gideon vs. Wainwright, 373 U.S. 335 (1963)</u>, the United States Supreme Court understood that "lawyers in criminal courts are necessities, not luxuries."

OCPD requests that the Judiciary Committee act favorably on this bill with the knowledge that comparable funding and resources will need to be allocated to DPDS to ensure the constitutional, zealous and competent representation we currently provide. Thank you.
