Raised Bill No. 5127 AN ACT REQUIRING A NEEDS ASSESSMENT FOR THE DELIVERY OF POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION PROGRAMS IN PRISONS

The Office of Chief Public Defender (OCPD) <u>supports</u> Raised H.B. 5127 (LCO 1001), as the legislation would support efforts to strengthen individuals, families, and communities, and to reduce recidivism, by requiring a comprehensive needs assessment for the delivery of postsecondary education programs in prisons.

It is fundamental that education is a key to an individual's reaching and maintaining socioeconomic stability. This is especially true for individuals who do not have generational wealth and other social supports on which they can rely. As public defenders, we represent such individuals in more than 100,000 court cases each year.

The next best thing to an individual's avoiding the carceral system altogether is for an individual's contact with that system to result in their being equipped with knowledge, skills, abilities, and resources that support greater stability and success afterward. Insofar as this legislation is part of Connecticut's work toward that goal – a goal which benefits individuals, families, communities, and our state as a whole – this office is in strong support.
