Testimony of Deborah Del Prete Sullivan, Legal Counsel, Director

Judiciary Committee Public Hearing – March 27, 2017 Raised Bill 7308 An Act Concerning a Task Force to Examine Issues Concerning the Use of Body-Worn Camera and Recording Equipment by Police

The Office of Chief Public Defender supports passage of this bill which would create a task force to review and make legislative recommendations regarding the use of body cameras by law enforcement. The Office thanks the Committee for including it in the membership of the Task Force. Intended to increase accountability of law enforcement, body camera legislation was adopted to improve trust between law enforcement and the communities served. However, body cameras are currently utilized by just over 10% of municipal police departments despite the availability of reimbursement funding. Pursuant to PA 15-4, a grant program was established in which the costs for the purchase of cameras and digital data storage devices or services (for a certain period of time) would be reimbursed to municipal and state university law enforcement. Currently, citing costs for storage of the videos, a number of departments have not implemented the use of the equipment. While the formation of a task force may not be able to provide funding readily, it could closely study the concerns of law enforcement, including the costs to implement the use of body cameras and storage. It could also study whether new technology exists that may assist in full implementation and how other states have been able to employ this technology. Therefore, the Office of Chief Public Defender requests that the Committee act favorably on this bill.
