Raised Bill 5545, An Act Concerning Local and State Cooperation in the Enforcement of Federal Immigration Law

The Office of Chief Public Defender **strongly opposes** Raised Bill 5545, An Act Concerning Local and State Cooperation in the Enforcement of Federal Immigration Law the Trust Act.

This proposal would mandate that local law enforcement detain anyone in their custody with a civil immigration detainer. This proposal would instill fear in the immigrant community and inhibit cooperation with the police and place our communities at risk. Currently, local law enforcement have discretion to determine when to detain an individual who is subject to a civil ICE detainer. Civil immigration detainers are not subject to the same standards as the issuance of a criminal warrant, which allows police to place an individual in custody. Local law enforcement agents should not be used to enforce federal law and our limited state and local resources should not be mandated to be utilized to assist Immigration Custom and Enforcement.
