### **Significant Impacts**

**Sections 1-6** revise appropriations for the General Fund, Special Transportation Fund, Banking Fund, Insurance Fund, Consumer Counsel and Public Utility Control Fund, and Workers' Compensation Fund, respectively. Proposed changes are shown in the table above.

**Section 7** amends section 41 of special act 21-15, as amended by section 306 of public act 21-2 of the June special session, to revise allocations pertaining to the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund. Proposed new allocations are shown in the table below.

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**Section 10** carries forward \$21,138,694 of lapsing General Fund appropriations from FY 2022 to FY 2023 to the Reserve for Salary Adjustments account to support the costs of accrued leave payouts anticipated as part of the retirement surge.

**Section 11** carries forward \$30,000,000 of lapsing General Fund appropriations from FY 2022 to FY 2023 to the Department of Labor to support costs of administering the unemployment insurance program.

**Section 12** transfers \$800,000 of unappropriated resources of the General Fund in FY 2022 to the Firefighters Cancer Relief Account to replace General Fund appropriations that lapsed in FY 2018 and FY 2019 before they could be transferred to the non-lapsing account.

**Section 13** transfers \$75,000 of unappropriated resources of the General Fund in FY 2022 to the Neglected Cemetery Account to support additional grants to municipalities beyond the fees collected under section 7-74 of the general statutes. Such additional grants must be matched by municipalities at 50% and must represent additional support beyond the amount budgeted by the municipality for the existing program.

**Section 14** transfers \$20,000,000 of unappropriated resources of the General Fund in FY 2022 to the University of Connecticut Health Center Medical Malpractice Trust Fund to restore funds that were swept as a budget balancing measure in FY 2010 and FY 2011.

**Section 15** carries forward \$400,000 in the Insurance Fund from FY 2022 to FY 2023 so that the Office of Health Strategy can complete the biennial statewide facilities and services plan as required under section 19a-634 of the general statutes.

**Section 16** carries forward \$100,000 in the Special Transportation Fund from FY 2022 to FY 2023 to support an interim staff person in the Department of Transportation to assist with coordinating and implementing federal infrastructure projects pursuant to the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act.

**Section 17** carries forward up to \$100,000,000 in the Special Transportation Fund for use by the Department of Transportation as matching funds for federal infrastructure grants. This pay-as-you-go approach will help avoid debt service costs that would be incurred if the match were bonded.

**Section 18** stipulates that not less than 50% of the allocation made in section 7 of this bill to Connecticut State Colleges and Universities from Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund for Short Term Recovery Funds shall be utilized to provide institutional financial aid to students enrolled at Connecticut State Colleges and Universities.

**Section 19** allows the Department of Public Health to charge costs of administering the Student Loan Repayment Program to the funds available for such program.

**Section 20** stipulates that the funding appropriated in section 1 to the Department of Public Health to restore forgone federal funding for Planned Parenthood of Southern New England, Inc., shall be made available only to the extent that federal grants for Title X family planning services are reduced.

Section 21 requires the Department and Children and Families (DCF) and the Division of Public Defender Services (PDS) to develop a plan to achieve federal reimbursement of legal representation in child protection services proceedings. Stipulates that the funding appropriated to PDS in section 1 for such representation prior to removal of a child may be made available upon receipt of the plan by the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management (OPM).

**Section 22** requires DCF to develop a plan to enhance services provided by youth service bureaus and juvenile review boards. Stipulates that the funding appropriated to DCF in section 1 for the purposes of implementing the plan may be made available upon its receipt by the OPM Secretary.

**Section 23** stipulates that the allocation made in section 7 of this bill to the Judicial Department for the Office of Victim Services shall be made available only to the extent that federal Victims of Crime Act Assistance grants are reduced.

**Section 24** removes an earmark for Project Oceanology. Instead, it is proposed that this entity apply for funds on a competitive basis, as other entities are generally required to do.

**Sections 25-31** revise revenues to support the Governor's proposed budget for FY 2023. Changes are proposed to the General Fund, Special Transportation Fund, Banking Fund, Insurance Fund, Consumer Counsel and Public Utility Control Fund, Workers' Compensation Fund, and Tourism Fund, respectively.
