Attny Phoenix-Sharpe of OTLtGov informed the group of over 100 interested stakeholders for the <u>overall</u> W &G Council... Efforts will be made to divide into existing subcmtes --- may be necessary to make subgroups within each to further broaden yet synthesize the work of each group.

Women's Health and Safety subcommittee Cross-Agency Efforts

- Reframing PREVENTION to be along a continuum from primary (*population level*) to the individual
- Discussion of work between agencies and stakeholders to reduce likelihood of removal of a child from caregiver while increasing capacity of parents & sharpening the safety lens.
- Efforts to mitigate the trauma of separation and interrupted attachments by incorporating best practices of different levels / frequency of home-visiting & care coordination as examples



Women's Health and Safety subcommittee Cross-Agency Efforts (con't)



Impact specifically to improved screening surveys of women during pre-natal and post birth experiences:

- Services available to female veterans
- Integrating questions about STIs
- When/How to incorp questions about healthy relationships & presence of IPV
- CAPTA legislation and birthing hospital notifications (*plans of safe care*)

* Exploring **Universal** screenings to decrease disparity, prejudice & some implicit biases

Women's Health and Safety subcommittee Cross-Agency Efforts (con't)



- **OEC** seeing increase in physicians making *Birth to Three* and specialty preschools earlier and more often
- OEC/DCF-- ECCP follow-up funding to prevent gap in service delivery
- DPH's ability to support additional competency skill-building trainings
- More work between IPV advocates, law enforcement & DCF on response protocols. Evaluating assessments to keep women safe when reporting abusive situations
- DOC's release and re-entry supports
 - Child development training
 - Building parental capacity in incarcerated parents
 - Incorporating more mother/child normative activities (*ie Girl Scouts Beyond Bars*)

Special women's health topic areas

 Incorporation of skilled assessment of MH & SU d/o screenings

• DMHAS:

- opioid use screenings across systems
- DMHAS continuum of care including OP and IOP programs,
- residential programs for pregnant and parenting women and
- the Women's **REACH** Program.

* Continue to evaluate the role that policy development, legislation and evaluation will have for this subcommittee's charge



Highlighting and Showcasing CT's Women & Girls Health and Safety efforts

- Examination & elevation of existing groups across CT to possibly create a resource directory of what's current, celebration of what's good & identification of gaps
- SubCommittee potentially developing a Health / Resource Fair
 - 1st examine the landscape of existing forums to reduce duplication and hone –in on target audience (*women, specific age cohort, providers, policy makers???*)
 - Some already scheduled for the fall; consider exploring spring 2020 timeline
 - Consider theme/special topic areas (*ie breast health, prevention vs diagnostic screening ins coverage**)





The 'Next Ups' (special attention to adolescent & young women)

- Inviting a group of 8th graders who wrote to the legislature about the issue of feminine hygiene product availability in schools
- Encouraging/mentoring girls' leadership, gender-based social justice and advocacy development to address women's related issues
