Work Stream Updates:

- Norm Sondheimer represented the Coding Challenge Group and reported the success of the first Lt Governor's Coding Challenge. The following suggestions were made to improve the next event:
 - Include technical artefact with ideas
 - Inform Teachers in advance so it may be included in their lesson plan throughout the year
 - Team up with outside organizations to increase diversity and assist in the process to further our efforts
- Abigail Jewitt from the information Hub outlined challenges the group is currently facing. One
 of which is the need for more participants. The other was investigating if there was already a
 vehicle in place that supports, teachers, parents and students. It was identified by Gwen
 Brantley that there is a tool called "STEM MAP" with STEM resources readily available to utilize.
 The information was shared with the committee to be analyzed.
- Debra Goss reported the Internship group has developed a toolkit. She explained that Department of Transportation is currently piloting a virtual internship for girls 8-12 grade to provide exposure to transportation technology. This is a three-week program.
