CEU Training: Cultural Competency, Systemic Racism or Systemic Oppression, Social Determinants of Health and Suicide Prevention



CEU Training Required by Statute

2 Hours Cultural Competency, Systemic Racism or Systemic Oppression

2 Hours Social Determinants of Health

2 Hours of training on (1) screening for post-traumatic stress disorder, risk of suicide, depression and grief, and (2) suicide prevention

Communications about the benefits of Community Health Worker Certification and membership in the Community Health Worker Association of Connecticut (CHWACT).

CHW - A Community Health Worker is:

A public health outreach professional with an in-depth understanding of the experience, language, culture and socioeconomic needs of the community and who provides a range of services, including, but not limited to, outreach, engagement, education, coaching, informal counseling, social support, advocacy, care coordination, research related to social determinants of health and basic screenings and assessments of any risks associated with social determinants of health. Common titles may include: health coach, community health advisor, family advocate, health educator, liaison, promoter, outreach worker, peer counselor, patient navigator, health interpreter and public health aide, etc.
