- Laura Morris addressed what we're calling sustainability and reimbursement models for Community health workers and explained there is a lot of work being done across the state agencies regarding funding. Health Equity Solutions is spearheading a CHW coalition just on reimbursement. Laura Morris asked if anyone in the meeting would like to be a part of this meeting to put their name and email in the chat and will make sure you're included on those invites.
- Melanie Alvarez announced Connecticut Together is organizing a legislative advocacy day for people with HIV and for HIV legislation specifically Bill No. 519, An Act Concerning HIV Testing, which will greatly affect our Community health workers. The event will be held on April 25th, on the North Steps of the Capitol at 10 a.m. There will be a rally and box lunches will be provided. If you're working in the Community, with people who are infected or affected by HIV please bring your folks out all are welcome it's open to the public.

## 4. Presentation by Mental Health Connecticut

## Marissa Russo

- Marissa Russo, Director of Specialized Residential Services discussed the services offered.
  One of the new Community support programs that is being offered is called Mental Health
  Concierge and what it is, is a recovery support program for folks who have a formal diagnosis
  of a mental illness. But also, just for folks who are kind of integrating back into the
  community and need support to place, it is a private pay hopefully soon to be picked up by
  private insurance companies.
- Offered throughout Connecticut, Mental Health Concierge supports individuals with maintaining a home, managing finances, negotiating external systems of support (physical and behavioral health), developing community connections, skill-building, and selfadvocating. These services are designed to (1) reduce symptomatology, (2) increase coping strategies, (3) teach life skills (4) decrease the use of emergency services, and (5) enhance the overall quality of life.
- The initial assessment fee is \$200 but will work with the client.
- Husky will not pay, but if they are on Medicaid through the mental health waiver then all of the services are covered.

## 5. CT Community Health Workers Day Celebration

#### Milagrosa Seguinot

- Milagrosa Seguinot announced April 7<sup>th</sup> has been Connecticut's official day to celebrate
  Community health workers since 2009. In the past, there have been various events held
  throughout the state. The last one was held at the Legislative Office. There was one planned at
  Gateway Community College but covid came and it was canceled. Hopefully will be able to get
  together at some point during the year and celebrate all the accomplishments and all the work
  the Community health workers have been doing during covid and have some time for selfcare.
- Milagrosa Seguinot sends an email to Community health workers every year reminding them
  to take time for themselves because we work hard and barely take time for ourselves. This is a
  good opportunity for all of us to remind those professional Community public health workers
  that are working with communities and present in their communities to say thank you for the

work that you have been doing. It's a very important day, and we should it at a state level.

Laura Morris thanked the Community health workers on the call and the employers who work
with Community health workers employee Community health workers train Community health
workers. She also thanked everyone for the time they commit to volunteering to serve on this
committee.

# 7. Development and Implementation of Apprenticeship Program for CHWs

#### **Laura Morris, OHS**

- Laura Morris provided background information on the development and implementation of the apprenticeship program for CHWs. During the days of the SIM CHW Initiative, the State Innovation Model, Meredith Ferraro, Fernando Morale, and others had researched and met with the Connecticut Department of Labor to decide to discuss getting a CHW apprenticeship started in Connecticut. They did quite a bit of work and had written documents presented it in many different forums and identified an employer at the time which was Optimists Healthcare in Bridgeport who worked with the SWAHEC and began to apply for and develop standards of apprenticeship for Community health workers. Discussions at this time talking about starting a core curriculum were just starting and when SIM ended the project sort of got lost in that transition.
- Discussed the Department of Labor criteria for apprenticeship occupations. Laura Morris also discussed the benefits of having an apprenticeship program for Community health workers.
- Laura Morris asked the CHWAB the following questions for discussion:
  - Should the CHWAB consider researching and pursuing the development and implementation of an Apprenticeship Program for CHWs?
    - Fernando Morales stressed the hardest part was getting the buy-in from the apprenticeship organization. Who will monitor this for the Department of Labor? What agencies are willing to participate in this program. would be the monitoring site?
    - Frika Lynch agreed that once the employer is on board, they are willing to give you money for training.
    - Melanie Alvarez suggested some centralized resources of organizations that host interns for folks to collaborate with one another in case there are openings for people in other places, so people can share in turn sort of at the Employment phase.
    - Milagrosa Seiguinot will connect Fernando Morales with SWAHEC's CEO.
  - Would a CHW Apprenticeship Program be a good fit for high school students/graduating high school students?
- There is a new Office of Workforce Strategy that has received some ARPA funding to train Community health workers. Laura Morris has been in touch with them on multiple occasions to see if some of that funding could be utilized for this apprenticeship Program.
