### Background

- Presentation on Statewide HIT Plan focus area activities during January meeting
- 25 strategic activities reduced to 10
- Council asked for guidance in prioritizing activities to "begin" in 2022 via survey
- Initial survey results presented during February meeting
- Survey closed February 28
- Majority of Council responded
- Four activities identified for prioritization in 2022

### **Top Selected Strategic Activities: 76% Response**

**Focus Area 4:** Support behavioral health providers with the adoption of EHR and HIE services

Develop an educational campaign for behavioral health providers and patients on the benefits and risks of health information exchange, focusing on ways to ensure data privacy while making sure the individual's care team can access the right information at the right time to provide the best care possible.



### **Top Selected Strategic Activities: 71% Response**

**Focus Area 3:** Improve service coordination and data sharing across state HHS agencies

Establish a workgroup for technical interoperability of HHS data systems including development standards. (Interagency HHS sharing)



### **Top Selected Strategic Activities: 65% Response**

**Focus Area 6:** Establish electronic data standards to facilitate development of integrated electronic health information systems

Develop a HITAC Standards Advisory Committee to provide recommendations on statutory changes needed relative to health data standards.



### **Top Selected Strategic Activities: 65% Response**

Focus Area 1: Sustain and increase use of statewide HIE services

Evaluate how best to optimize Connie for public health data exchange and seek ways to use Connie's services to improve data availability and reporting to state-operated data systems, positioning the entity to deliver on its value proposition. Look to make Connie infrastructure a shared public utility service.

### All Payer Claims Database (APCD) Advisory Group

#### **Committee Structure:**

20-member committee created by P.A. 12-166 and codified in C.G.S. §17b-59f

- Chaired by the Health Information Technology Officer (HITO) or designee Mandated members are:
  - Commissioners or designees (8) OPM, OSC, DSS, DPH, DHMAS, DOI, Health Care Advocate, Chief Information Officer
  - Representatives State medical society, insurance companies (3), insurance purchaser, hospitals, Data Release Committee and a health care provider
  - Additional members recommended by the HITO (4) -
    - 1. Two health care experts, each from an academic institution
    - 2. An expert in payment reform
    - 3. A representative of OHS



### **APCD Advisory Group**

Advisory Group is a standing workgroup of the HITAC

#### **OHS consults the Advisory Group when:**

- 1. Contracting for, planning, implementing and administering the APCD
- 2. Obtaining claims data from the State's medical assistance program and Medicare Part A or B
- **3.** Any action to obtain Medicaid and CHIP data
- 4. Contracting for the collection, management or analysis of data from reporting entities
- 5. Leveraging APCD data to increase efficiency, enhance outcomes, and improve understanding of healthcare expenditures

#### **Purpose of the APCD**

1. To provide health services consumers in the state information on the cost and quality of health care services to aid health care related decision-making

Office of Health Strategy

2. To be made available to any state agency, insurer, employer, health care provider, consumer, researcher or Access Health CT to review healthcare services utilization, costs and quality while protecting patient privacy

#### **Meetings**

Quarterly and public

### **APCD Advisory Group - Sub Committees**

#### Data Privacy & Security Committee

- 1. Conducted a review and analysis of data security, privacy, and data release policies and procedures.
- 2. Met for fixed duration in 2019

#### Data Release Committee

- 1. Deliberates on data releases external to OHS
- 2. Membership
  - i. Advisory Group member and representative of state agency,
  - ii. APCD data manager,
  - iii. public health specialist,
  - iv. health insurance industry,
  - v. attorney specialized in health care, privacy and research,
  - vi. healthcare professional,
  - vii. hospital administrator with a background in analytics and research,
  - viii. health researcher,
  - ix. two consumer representatives with background in health policy, patient advocacy, and/or patient safety
- 3. Meets Monthly, 2nd Tuesday of each month, or as needed



### **APCD Advisory Group – 2022 Strategic Objectives**

- Review and approve the APCD Advisory Group Charter
- Establish a Denied and Dental Claims Workgroup to advise on data submission guide amendments
- Develop stakeholder engagement campaign to encourage self-insured employers to submit to CT APCD
- Develop data use case recommendations
- Review and approve updated APCD Policies and Procedures for data release

The APCD comprises **medical**, **pharmacy**, **dental**\* and **other insurance**\* claims information from enrollment and eligibility files

- 7. Claims volume by product line to support Connie federal funding match analyses (26% CMS cost share increased to 40%)

### **CT APCD Federal Funding - Update**

- OHS is managing CT APCD without additional funding and limited analytic resources
- Federal funding opportunity
  - No Surprises Act grant of \$2.5m over three years for states to establish or enhance APCD to support market transparency efforts and research
  - To date the funds have not been appropriated
  - Still awaiting guidance from Federal Dept. of Labor about grant requirements
- Secretary of Labor established a State APCD Advisory Committee (SAPCDAC) March October 2021:
  - Comprised of experts/representatives:

State APCD, health economist, Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS), National Center for Health Statistics, Office of the National Coordinator for Health Information, HHS Office of the Civil Rights, Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality, Employer Sponsor of a Group Health Plan, Employee Organization Sponsor of a Group Health Plan, academic researcher, consumer advocate, Chair of APCD Council, and Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation



### **CT APCD Federal Funding – SAPCDAC Update**

SAPCDAC Report makes 14 Recommendations in 4 Key Areas

- Standardized data layout
- Data submission process
- Data privacy, security and release
- Voluntary data submission process
  - Voluntary submission of self-insured data using the APCD-Common Data Layout
