AISP EQUITY IN PRACTICE LEARNING COMMUNITY GRANT


- This grant will allow us to develop sustainable procedures and tools for incorporating resident perspectives and equity into state data integration efforts.
- Grant objectives include:
 - a. Complete planning and launch a Resident Advisory Board for P20 WIN
 - b. Develop equity and ethics impact assessment tools and related rubrics for review of data requests
 - c. Identify opportunities to increase collection and reporting of standardized race, ethnicity, and language data
 - d. Develop procedures and tools to report publicly on efforts to promote equity through data integration



OVERVIEW

- P20 WIN is Connecticut's state longitudinal data system and is the mechanism by which data from multiple agencies are matched to address critical policy questions. P20 WIN informs sound policies and practice through secure sharing of longitudinal data across participating agencies to ensure that individuals successfully navigate supportive services and educational pathways into the workforce.
- P20 WIN is a federated data system that has been operational since 2014. P20 WIN is
 used to answer policy questions, fulfill federal and state reporting requirements; support
 program review; inform school districts of postsecondary outcomes; provide employment
 and wage outcome data; and support research and analysis on a variety of topics.

GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE

- P20 WIN has an Executive Board, a Data Governing
 Board and Data Stewards that provide the structure to
 create and implement the necessary policies and procedures
 for a multi-agency Data Sharing system to address broad
 policy questions and state needs.
 - Respond to data requests.
 - Determine authorized Users and access rights.
 - Develop and maintain a cross-agency Data Dictionary
 - Add, Suspend and Readmit Participating Agencies
 - Responsible for P20WIN Policies, Staffing and Financial Support
- **Data Stewards** are identified by each Participating Agency to maintain and create datasets for approved data requests.
- The **Resident Advisory Board** will provide accountability and transparency for data requests that seek to use data from marginalized communities. RAB members will have lived experience in poverty and have been or are currently users of state services.

P20 WIN EQUITY COMMITMENTS

- Executive Board duties and responsibilities:
 - Assist the Data Sharing process to ensure that the work always promotes equity and that research and data sharing efforts do not disparately impact consumers or families
 - Develop a plan to establish a Resident Advisory Board with the same goal, and to also advise agencies in earning public trust, preventing misuse of data and advise on questions about consent, privacy, data retention / destruction
- Data Governing Board duties and responsibilities:
 - Establish a process to regularly review, and on an annual basis, produce a report on the efforts of P20 WIN to promote equity and that research and data sharing efforts do not disparately impact consumers or families

 - Reviewed the APCD-DRC charter
 - A member asked that language be included in the charter to align better with PA 21-35 (REL)

APCD-DRC Charter Amendment

Article 2: Purpose

Section 1: The purpose of the APCD-DRC shall be to:

- (i) review and approve or deny Data Release Applications submitted by Applicants for the release of Data (in accordance with policy and established procedures);
- (ii) provide support to the OHS during the receipt and review of Data Release Applications; and
- (iii) assess the potential impact of the release of data on Connecticut residents, including for disparate impact by race, ethnicity, language, sex, gender identity, disability status or other factors.
