Approach for creation of BPMH 2. Online directory of tools & solutions (tie) 2. Assessment of the pros & cons of an expanded PDMP for achieving the BPMH (tie) 4. Development of deprescribing standards & practice Nitu and Sean led a discussion reviewing the scope and potential interdependencies of the four proposed activities. Nitu stated that it will be important, as a next step, to identify and define the tasks that would be involved to accomplish the activities the group will be focusing on, and to constrain the scope and define a work breakdown structure that will accomplish the deliverables prior to the end of the current fiscal year. Brenda Shipley suggested that the environmental scan should focus more on targeted SME interviews and other methods for gathering information from the HIE industry and other sources, as opposed to a formal "literature review" in the academic sense. CedarBridge Group can assist with interview guides and can leverage its relationships in the industry to facilitate this activity. "Assessment of PDMP expansion;" Rod Marriott stated that the PDMP has obtained some initial lessons learned from expanding the scope of the PDMP for certain "non-controlled substance" medications and devices, which should provide some preliminary data that may be useful for projecting some initial estimates around the resourcing that would be needed for any further expansion. Rod stated that navigating the regulatory landscape and the related requirements may pose a challenge. Nitu proposed that a component of the environmental scan could be to evaluate what some of the PDMP/HIE models exist and evaluate the pros and cons, etc. for those models. Nitu stated that it will be necessary to shift the focus from the "what we're doing" to the "when" and the "how" if the group is going to be able to accomplish the proposed activities prior to September 30th, 2021. In order to keep the tasks moving forward, it may be necessary to tap into some of the MRPC membership for some "offline" work that's outside of the monthly calls. Bucketing these tasks and forming designated working groups was proposed as a potential structure framework.
