	<b>Call to Order</b> The regularly scheduled meeting of the Healthcare Cabinet was held on Tuesday, January 8, 2019 at the State Capitol Building Room 310 in Hartford, CT. The meeting convened at 9:02 a.m. Victoria Veltri presiding.

	Once a quorum was established, a motion was made by Patricia Baker and seconded by Shelly Sweatt to approve the minutes of the Health Care Cabinet November 13, 2018 meeting. Nichelle Mullins abstained. <b>Motion carried.</b>

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<b>5.</b>	<b>Health Information Technology Update</b>	<b>Allan Hackney</b>
<p>Allan Hackney, the Health Information Technology Officer, provided an update on Health Information Technology Office (HITO).</p> <p>Allan stated that currently the HITO is moving from a concept to execution in partnership with the Office of the State Comptroller (OSC). They are working together on a prototype of the Electronic Clinical Quality Measures (eCQM) program, based on the needs of the OSC for managing their Health Enhancement Program.</p> <p>An update of the eCQM and Health Information Exchange (HIE) infrastructure ensued. Allan stated that speed is of the essence, it has been a long time and Connecticut is in need to get this data moving. It's about making the connection with the healthcare centers and getting the data where it needs to be.</p> <p>Nichelle Mullins wanted to know where the Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) fits in this particular model.</p> <p>Allan responded that the FQHC's will be one of the first adaptors when it becomes available. Currently the most contemporary technology is of the FQHC partner who is participating with HIE.</p> <p>Pat Baker asked if Allan had a timeline set for it to go live.</p> <p>Allan's replied that the goal is to go live at the end of March 2019.</p> <p><b>Entity Update</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Article of Incorporations are currently at the Office of Policy Management for signature.</li> <li>• The bylaws and ethics policies have been drafted and are ready for the first board meeting.</li> <li>• An interim Chief Operating Officer was announced to be Sabina Sitaru and other key operational staff have been hired or are in the recruitment stage.</li> <li>• The staff will focus on the trust framework; business plan; onboarding procedures.</li> </ul> <p>Allan indicated that the Support Act HR6 Sec. 5042 is seen as a new opportunity for HIT. The Support Act provides for considerable resources to address the current opioid crisis. An explanation of the HIT Implications of SEC 5042 ensued.</p> <p><b>All Payers Claims Database (APCD) Update</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Currently mapping Medicaid data and its availability is targeted for March 2019.</li> <li>• Operational transfer from APCD to OHS targeted to start end of January 2019.</li> </ul>		

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- Plan to extract the data from APCD into Core Data and Analytics (CDAS) to start the beginning of February 2019.

Pat Baker noted that Allan mentioned that the capacity is limited. Is the CDAS a work around or it is a solution or a long term fix?

Allan explained that the capacity issue and operations largely resides within Access Health CT. We could tap into the vendor that currently houses the APCD information but there are budgetary issues. Long term the CDAS is placed when we need to be doing analytics, we need to figure out the right timing.

Pat Baker additionally asked if the Medicare data is also a part of the APCD data. Allan said yes and along with Medicare, Fee for Service and Medicare Advantage were also a part of the APCD data.

Ms. Veltri mentioned that resources are an issue and that OHS is looking to obtain some analytic support very soon to provide additional support.

### Transparency Website

An explanation of how the website will function followed.

- Statutes state that the office will be transparent.
- The data for the Quality Score card, developed through State Innovation Model (SIM), is derived from the APCD data. Integration of the scorecard and its availability will be early next year. SIM and its partner University of Connecticut are developing a metric and mechanism to filter the scores.
- The Consumer transparency website will be where consumers would be able to better evaluate and manage their health care.
- The transparency plan was explained for the website for the Quality Score Card. The fully identifiable data would be available mid-March.

Arlene Murphy thanked Allan for the terrific presentation. Arlene asked if there was a timeline available for families to be able to review the cost and quality on the website. Allan stated that on a fully identified bases the information would be available March or early April.

Ms. Veltri noted that the Quality Council Group has been involved with this process and has agreed on the measures that are included on the scorecard.

Cabinet Cost Containment Sub Group is currently reviewing the priority recommendations, the work group will reconvene to finalize approach for priorities. Lastly OHS as previously stated by Ms. Veltri has allocated \$100K to support analytics.

Arlene Murphy asked if will there be patients or families as a part of the board of the HIE Entity?

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Allan responded that yes, the Board it composed of 8 members by statue one of them must be a consumer health care member and appointed by the governor.

Paul Lombardo asked if is there are plans to put a qualifier as people are reviewing the commercial data on the website?

Allan responded that it is absolutely our intention to place a qualifier.

Miriam Delphin-Ritmon asked if the HIE allow for information exchange for research and policy development purposes in addition to health care provisions?

Allan stated that the trust framework stipulates the permitted purpose of the data that would come through HIE. The framework is singular in nature, the expectations are that agencies will sign on and there will be an exchange of data for the purpose they are permitted.

Frances Padilla would like to know how the APCD would fit in with OPM data office.

Allan mentioned that if we are discussing non identifiable data, we fully expect that we will participate with the OPM office. If it is identifiable there will be regulations that will apply.

Kate McEvoy stated that this data would be of incredible value to Medicaid.

Ms. Veltri stated that she is looking forward to working with Allan, OPM and all our fellow Commissioners.

Ms. Veltri thanked Mr. Hackney for the report.
