Re: Final Decision, Docket Number 02-1511 Greater Waterbury Imaging Center Replacement of a MRI Unit

Dear Ms. Gianotti:

On October 25, 2002, the Office of Health Care Access ("OHCA") received your letter requesting a waiver of the Certificate of Need ("CON") process in accordance with Section 19a-639c of the Connecticut General Statutes ("C.G.S."). The Greater Waterbury Imaging Center ("GWIC") is proposing to replace its existing magnetic resonance imaging ("MRI") unit at a projected capital expenditure of \$1,171,120.

Please be advised that OHCA has reviewed the information submitted, and makes the following findings regarding your request:

- 1. On April 1, 1999, under Docket Number 98-1004, the GWIC was authorized to acquire an open MRI unit at a total capital expenditure of \$1,224,300.
- 2. The GWIC is proposing to replace its existing open MRI with the purchase of a high-field wide-open MRI unit. The replacement equipment will be a 1.5T GE Echospeed unit.
- 3. The GWIC has been providing MRI services to the Greater Waterbury-area since 1989. The project is intended to serve the following municipalities: Cheshire, Middlebury, Naugatuck, Prospect, Southbury, Southington, Torrington, Waterbury, Watertown, and Wolcott.

- 4. The total capital expenditure associated with the MRI replacement project is \$1,171,120. The cost components are as follows: \$142,800 for construction/renovations; \$964,453 for the imaging equipment purchase; \$57,867 for sales tax; and \$6,000 for delivery and installation. Project financing will be via the GWIC's equity, as well as a conventional loan. The total expenditure of \$1,171,120 is below the \$2,000,000 threshold for determining eligibility for waiver of the CON process pursuant to Section 19a-639c, C.G.S.
- 5. The proposed expenditure for the replacement MRI unit is not more than the original cost, plus an increase of ten percent for each twelve-month period that has elapsed since April 1, 1999.

Based on the above findings, OHCA has determined that the GWIC's proposal to replace its existing open MRI with a high-field wide-open 1.5T GE Echospeed unit meets the requirements for waiver of the CON process pursuant to Section 19a-639c, C.G.S. Therefore, the Greater Waterbury Imaging Center's proposal to replace its existing MRI unit, at a total capital expenditure of \$1,171,120, is approved and a Certificate of Need is granted. Additionally, GWIC will provide to OHCA evidence of the disposition of the existing MRI unit by no later than May 30, 2003.
