Housatonic Valley Radiological Associates, P.C. Acquire a CT scanner for Ridgefield practice location

Dear Dr. Ehrlich:

On June 30, 2005, the Office of Health Care Access ("OHCA") received a Certificate of Need ("CON") Determination request from Housatonic Valley Radiological Associates, P.C. ("Applicant") for the acquisition of a CT scanner for 38 Grove Street in Ridgefield, Connecticut. Additional information was submitted on September 23, 2005. Please be advised that OHCA has reviewed your request and makes the following findings:

1. Housatonic Valley Radiological Associates, P.C. proposes to acquire a GE Prospeed CT scanner. Related project costs are as follows:

Site Preparation Costs	\$147,000
CT scanner	\$ 85,000
Sales tax	\$ 5,100
Delivery & Installation	<u>Included</u>
Total project cost	\$237,100

- 2. No facility fee will be charged.
- 3. A binding purchase agreement was entered into between the Applicant and Barrington Medical Imaging, LLC prior to July 1, 2005, wherein the Applicant agrees to buy a GE ProSpeed CT scanner at an equipment purchase price of \$85,000. The contract required \$5,000 down payment at the time of signing. The \$5,000 down payment was paid by the Applicant on June 28, 2005. A cancelled check has been provided to OHCA.

Based on the above findings, OHCA has determined that Housatonic Valley Radiological Associates, P.C. is not required to file a Certificate of Need request for the purchase of a CT scanner for 38 Grove Street in Ridgefield, Connecticut as the Applicant made certain binding commitments related to this CT scanner acquisition prior to the implementation of Public Act 05-93. The Applicant has provided to OHCA satisfactory evidence that it purchased the CT scanner for under \$400,000 prior to July 1, 2005 and further OHCA authorization is not required.

The Applicant is required to provide to OHCA, by December 31, 2005, evidence that the Applicant has, by that date, taken full possession of the CT scanner. Any request to provide such evidence beyond that date, must be accompanied by a full and satisfactory explanation as to the specific and previously unforeseen barriers which have or do exist, which prevent the Applicant taking full possession by December 31, 2005.
