Re: Certificate of Need Determination, Report Number 05-30574-DTR Bradley Memorial Hospital and Health Center Replacement of Existing Nuclear Camera

Dear Mr. Capone:

On August 16, 2005, the Office of Health Care Access ("OHCA") received a Certificate of Need Determination request regarding the proposal of Bradley Memorial Hospital and Health Center ("BMH") to replace its existing nuclear camera.

Please be advised that OHCA has reviewed the information contained in your request and makes the following findings:

- 1. BMH is an acute care hospital located at 81 Meriden Avenue, Southington, Connecticut.
- 2. BMH proposes to replace its existing nuclear camera with a Siemens e.cam TM signature series Dual Detector Gamma Camera.
- 3. The existing nuclear camera is nine (9) years old and due to the age of the equipment it has the following shortcomings:
  - a. Excessive down time;
  - b. Difficult to repair; and
  - c. Difficult to find replacement parts

- 4. The proposed replacement nuclear camera will offer the following benefits:
  - a. Higher resolution;
  - b. Greater throughput;
  - c. Increased image quality; and
  - d. Improved patient care
- 5. BMH stated that the proposed replacement nuclear camera will provide improved access for the patients living in the towns of Berlin, Bristol, Cheshire, Meriden, New Britain, Plainville and Southington.
- 6. The total expenditure for the proposed nuclear camera is as follows:

Table One: Total Capital Expenditure	
Nuclear Camera	\$378,330
Renovations	20,000
Total Capital Expenditure	\$398,330

7. BMH will fund this proposal through the Hospital's Barnes Endowment Fund.

Based on the above findings, OHCA determines that the proposal of Bradley Memorial Hospital and Health Center to replace its existing nuclear camera for a total capital expenditure of \$398,330 is below the \$400,000 threshold for major medical equipment, as set forth under Section 19a-639 of the Connecticut General Statutes; therefore, a Certificate of Need is not required.
