CON Exemption Pursuant to Section 19a-639b, C.G.S.
Establish Outpatient Psychiatric Clinic for Children in Farmington

Dear Ms. Hess:

The Office of Health Care Access ("OHCA") is in receipt of your request for exemption from the Certificate of Need ("CON") process, pursuant to Section 19a-639b of the Connecticut General Statutes ("C.G.S."), to establish an outpatient psychiatric clinic for children at 263 Farmington Avenue in Farmington.

Upon review of the information contained in the request, OHCA finds the following:

- 1. Wheeler Clinic, Inc. is a non-profit facility that provides substance abuse services at various locations in Connecticut.
- 2. Wheeler Clinic, Inc. is proposing to provide a Green House Crisis Stabilization Program, on the campus of the University of Connecticut Medical Center, 263 Farmington Avenue, Farmington.
- 3. Currently this program provides a short-term therapeutic environment for youth ages 11 17 who are in need of crisis stabilization. The staff at Green House work collaboratively with Emergency mobile Psychiatric Service teams to provide interventions designed to de-escalate at risk situations, aftercare planning and linkages to ongoing community supports.

- 4. DCF, in a letter dated April 25, 2006, from Commissioner Darlene Dunbar, MSW, supports the proposal and the waiver of the CON requirements, pursuant to Section 19a-639b, C.G.S.
- 5. DCF states that the services provided by this program are consistent with DCF ongoing work of providing in-home family therapy while the youth resides in the program.
- 6. The total capital expenditure associated with the proposal is \$100,000.

Based on the above findings, OHCA has determined that Wheeler Clinic, Inc.'s request to establish an outpatient psychiatric clinic for children at 263 Farmington Avenue in Farmington meets the exemption requirements of Section 19a-639b of the Connecticut General Statutes and, therefore, is exempt from OHCA's CON process. Termination of these services would require CON approval, pursuant to Section 19a-638, C.G.S.
