Community Health Center's Israel Putnam School Based Health Center in Meriden

Dear Ms. Flinter:

On December 18, 2006, the Office of Health Care Access ("OHCA") received your application for exemption from the Certificate of Need ("CON") process for the establishment of a school based health center at Israel Putnam School ("IPS") located at 133 Parker Avenue, Meriden, Connecticut.

Please be advised that OHCA has reviewed the information submitted in your request and makes the following findings:

- 1. Community Health Center, Inc. ("CHC") is a private, non-profit, Federally Qualified health Center ("FQHC") located in Clinton, Groton, Meriden, Middletown, New Britain, New London, Norwalk, Old Saybrook, and Stamford, Connecticut.
- 2. Community Health Center, Inc. ("CHC") proposes to establish a school based health center ("clinic") at IPS in Meriden.
- 3. CHC will provide mental health social work services including assessment and brief treatment of psychological, social, and emotional problems.
- 4. The clinic will also provide oral health services including dental screening/assessments, oral health education, x-rays, and sealants.
- 5. The clinic will be location entirely on the property of the IPS site.

- 6. The proposed capital expenditure to establish the clinic is \$1,000.
- 7. The operation of the clinic will begin in January 2007.
- 8. The proposed clinic will be licensed by Department of Public Health ("DPH") as an outpatient clinic.

Based on the above findings, OHCA determines that the proposal of the Community Health Center, Inc. to establish a school-based health clinic at Israel Putnam School located at 133 Parker Avenue, Meriden, Connecticut meets the requirements of Section 19a-639(e) of the Connecticut General Statutes, and, therefore, is exempt from OHCA's Certificate of Need process.
