Uncompensated Care Cost (UC Costs) are the costs hospitals incur providing care for which no payment is received from a patient or insurer (Charity Care or Bad Debt). Most of the hospitals incurring the highest UC Costs tend to be large urban hospitals, which are likely to be located in areas with a higher uninsured population. On a statewide average basis, the UC Costs trended upward in FY 14 due to large increases in UC Costs for a number of the larger urban hospitals. On a statewide median basis, UC Costs decreased due to the majority of smaller community hospitals experiencing a reduction in UC Costs compared to the prior year.

UC Costs as a percentage of hospital net patient service revenue measures the impact on hospital receipts for providing care to charity care patients or patients who are able but unwilling to pay. Being a large tertiary hospital is not necessarily indicative of a high-percentage in this category. Further a lower net revenue amount may result in a higher percentage in this calculation. The statewide average continued to trend downward at a moderate rate, while the statewide median increased slightly because total statewide UC Costs increased overall from FY 13 to FY 14.

The statewide average and median uninsured as a percent of total discharges continued to decrease during FY 14. This is likely to be the result of the increase in the number of people enrolled in the Medicaid program under Health Care Reform as well as enrollment into the Access Health Connecticut program. A higher percentage may indicate a higher level of uninsured, a lower level of total discharges or a combination of both.
