	Below are some of the items in the presentation:					
	The Corporate Practice of Medicine (CPOM) doctrine specifies that a corporation may					
	not be licensed to practice medicine, members in a corporation to practice medicine					
	must be licensed, and for-profit corporations cannot form or own any part of a					
	professional corporation.					



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- In CT, several state agencies deal with the CPOM including the Department of Public Health, Office of Health Strategy, and Office of the Attorney General.
- Statutes related to the CPOM include C.G.S. § 20-9(a) and C.G.S. §19a-19.
- Statutes defining the incorporation of physicians are C.G.S. §33-182a and C.G.S. §34-243.
- Statutes defining medical foundations are C.G.S. § 33-182a and C.G.S. § 34-243.
- CPOM laws vary in states neighboring Connecticut (CT) such as Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York and Rhode Island.
- In CT the CPOM is monitored through Medical Foundations based on certain legislative statutes.
