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3.	Approval of the January 26 th Meeting Minutes	Lesley Bennett		
	The motion was made by Elsa Stone and seconded by Lisa Trumble to approve the January 26, 2021 PCCHR meeting summary. Vote was taken by roll call.Abstained: Alex Geertsma. Motion Passed.Ms. Bennett announced that Dr. Alex Geertsma is a new member on the PCCHR Workgroup.			
4.	Connecticut's Healthcare Benchmark Initiatives	Michael Bailit, Bailit Health		
	 Michael Bailit, of Bailit Health, presented on the Connecticut's Healthcare Benchmark Initiatives (see meeting presentation here). Mr. Bailit reviewed the healthcare affordability and quality in Connecticut. He also reviewed how Connecticut's Healthcare Benchmark Initiative ties to the charge of the PCCHR. The Work Group discussed the presentation. There was a suggestion for the group to define primary care. It was noted that the Cost Growth Benchmark Technical Team defined primary care in terms of provider type and services. It was mentioned that it is for the primary care spend and investment part and will not limit PCCHR in the models to produce other things that are related to community health. There was a discussion about opportunities to reduce spending and cost that is associated with the administration of medicine. It was noted that there is a distinction between the work of PCCHR and the primary care spend target. There was a request for the Mathematica Report to be shared with the group. It was noted that there will be additional opportunities to discuss Connecticut's Healthcare Benchmark Initiative at a future meeting. 			
5.	Chronic Medication Management Models	Marie Smith, PharmD, FNAP & Mary Mulrooney, PharmD, MBA UConn School of Pharmacy		
	 Marie Smith and Mary Mulrooney, of UConn School of Pharmacy, presented on the Chronic Medication Management Models: Pharmacists on Expanded Primary Care and Population Health Teams. Background information was provided on Comprehensive Medication Management (CMM), Clinical Pharmacist Training Credentials, and Pharmacist Practice Models. An introduction of the CMM practice models was provided. There was an overview provided of the work that was completed with the Office of Health Strategy under the State Innovation Model (SIM), that looked at pharmacist 			



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	in CT that were in CMM Practice Models. Lessons learned from the SIM Technical Assistance Program were reviewed. The Work Group discussed the presentation.

A recommendation was made to set up a subgroup of the Primary Care and Community Care Reforms Workgroup to engage on the Health Enhancement Community Initiative and community health. Additional details will be forthcoming. There was a suggestion to define and clarify terms such as "inequities" and "disparities". Mario Garcia volunteered to send to the group a few definitions for clarity regarding the use of terms related to equity discussions.
