Summary of Quality Council Recommendations from October Meeting (1 of 5)

- During the October meeting, the Quality Council reviewed the Phase 2 Quality Benchmark values and...
 - recommended changes to the 2025 Quality Benchmark values for the Phase 2 Measures when the values did not seem appropriate given recent performance on the measures, and
 - recommended 2024 Quality Benchmark Values for the Phase 2 Measures, which had not yet been established.



Summary of Quality Council Recommendations from October Meeting (2 of 5)

• The Quality Council recommended the following <u>commercial values</u> for 2024 and 2025:

* The Quality Council recommended <u>decreasing</u> the 2025 Benchmark value for *Follow-up After ED Visit for Mental Illness* and recommended <u>increasing</u> the 2025 Benchmark value for *Follow-up After Hospitalization for Mental Illness* given recent Connecticut performance on the measures.



Summary of Quality Council Recommendations from October Meeting (3 of 5)

 The Quality Council recommended the following <u>Medicaid values</u> for 2024 and 2025:

* The Quality Council recommended <u>decreasing</u> the 2025 Benchmark values for *Follow-up After ED Visit for Mental Illness* and *Follow-up After Hospitalization for Mental Illness* given recent Connecticut performance on the measure, but still keeping the values significantly above 2022 Connecticut performance to motivate improvement on the measures.

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Summary of Quality Council Recommendations from October Meeting (4 of 5)

The Quality Council also reviewed recent performance on the <u>Obesity</u>
 <u>Equity Measure</u>. As a reminder, the Obesity Equity Measure is the ratio
 of statewide obesity rates for the Black, non-Hispanic population and the
 White, non-Hispanic population calculated using BRFSS data.

↓ indicates that obesity rate decreased from prior year, ↑ indicates obesity rate increased from prior year



Summary of Quality Council Recommendations from October Meeting (5 of 5)

After reviewing recent performance, the Quality Council recommended modifying the methodology for calculating <u>Obesity</u>
 <u>Equity Measure</u> and recommended new 2024 and 2025 Benchmark values for the measure.

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Update from OHS on Quality Benchmark Values for Phase 2 Measures (1 of 2)

OHS has considered the Quality Council's recommendations from the October meeting and shares the following:

1. OHS plans to accept the Quality Council's recommended commercial and Medicaid Quality Benchmark values for *Child* and Adolescent Well-Care Visits, Follow-up After Hospitalization for Mental Illness (7-Day), and Follow-up After ED Visit for Mental Illness (7-Day).



Update from OHS on Quality Benchmark Values for Phase 2 Measures (2 of 2)

- 2. OHS plans to **retain the original specifications for the statewide** *Obesity Equity Measure* (i.e., ratio of Black non-Hispanic and White non-Hispanic obesity rates) to maintain continuity of the Quality Benchmark measures and to focus on reducing inequities between the two populations.
 - To address the concerns raised by the Quality Council during the October meeting, OHS plans to report on the statewide obesity rate for the Black non-Hispanic population separately. **Does the Quality Council recommend reporting this rate against the group's recommended Benchmark values for 2024 and 2025?**

Discuss 2024 and 2025 Benchmark Values for Obesity Equity Measure



Obesity Equity Measure (1 of 2)

- Given that OHS plans to retain the original methodology for calculating the Obesity Equity measure, we will solicit the Quality Council's input on:
 - whether the 2025 Quality Benchmark value for the measure is still appropriate given recent performance, and
 - what the **2024 Quality Benchmark value** for the measure should be (i.e., how far below the 2025 value).



Statewide

Obesity Equity Measure (2 of 2)

A lower rate indicates better performance

- Does the Quality Council think the 2025 Quality Benchmark value for this measure is still appropriate given recent CT performance?
- How far above the 2025 Quality Benchmark value should OHS set the 2024 Quality Benchmark value?
