BE IT RESOLVED BY THE STATE BOND COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CONNECTICUT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. In accordance with Public Act No. 86–420 of the February 1986 Session of the General Assembly of the State of Connecticut, as amended (the "Act"), the State Treasurer is hereby authorized to issue and sell State Revolving Fund General Revenue Bonds of the State (the "General Revenue Bonds") authorized by this Commission to be issued in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$250,000,000 and State Revolving Fund General Revenue Refunding Bonds of the State (the "Refunding Bonds" and, together with the General Revenue Bonds, the "Bonds") authorized by this Commission to be issued in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$125,000,000. The Treasurer is delegated the authority to determine the terms and particulars of the Bonds, including any series designation or other action as may be considered necessary or desirable in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds, in accordance with the provisions of the resolution hereinafter mentioned.

Section 2. The Treasurer is authorized to sell such Bonds at public sale on sealed proposals or by negotiation, in such manner, at such price or prices, at such time or times, and on such terms and conditions as the Treasurer shall determine to be in the best interests of the State.

Section 3. Pursuant to the State Revolving Fund General Revenue Bond Program General Bond Resolution adopted on December 17, 2002 (the "General Resolution") and in accordance with Section 9 of the Act, the issuance of the General Revenue Bonds, shall be authorized by a Supplemental Resolution of the State containing the terms and conditions of its issuance and delivery. The Supplemental Resolution submitted to this Commission entitled "A Supplemental Resolution Authorizing the Issuance of \$250,000,000 State Revolving Fund General Revenue Bonds" (the "Supplemental Resolution") is hereby approved, with such changes, substitutions, deletions, additions or amendments as the Treasurer shall determine to be necessary or appropriate, in the best interest of the State and in accordance with the intent of its passage at this meeting, and any and all delegations of authority granted under the Supplemental Resolution to the Treasurer are hereby expressly ratified.

Section 4. Pursuant to the General Resolution and in accordance with Section 9 of the Act, the issuance of the Refunding Bonds, shall be authorized by a Refunding Supplemental Resolution of the State containing the terms and conditions of its issuance and delivery. The Refunding Supplemental Resolution submitted to this Commission entitled "A Refunding Supplemental Resolution Authorizing the Issuance of \$125,000,000 State Revolving Fund Refunding General Revenue Bonds" (the "Refunding Supplemental Resolution") is hereby approved, with such changes, substitutions, deletions, additions or amendments as the Treasurer shall determine to be necessary or appropriate, in the best interest of the State and in accordance with the intent of its passage at this meeting, and any and all delegations of authority granted under the Refunding Supplemental Resolution to the Treasurer are hereby expressly ratified.

Section 5. The Treasurer is hereby further authorized to cause the preparation and distribution of one or more Preliminary Official Statements of the State for use in connection with the offering and sale of the Bonds. Upon the sale of the Bonds, the Treasurer shall prepare and distribute one or more final Official Statements and is hereby authorized to execute and deliver such Official Statements to the purchasers of the Bonds in the name and on behalf of the State.
