STATE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR ESTABLISHING COMMUNITY HOUSING LAND BANK AND LAND TRUST

REQUESTED:

Approval, pursuant to subsection (e) of section 8-214d of the Connecticut General Statutes, for the Commissioner of the Department of Housing to convey Community Housing Land Bank and Land Trust property on Phelps Road in East Windsor to the Town of East Windsor. The municipality shall use the land or interests in land, or shall cause the land or interests in land to be used for, or in conjunction with, activities related to, or similar to, any program administered by the commissioner pursuant to state or federal law

REASON FOR REQUEST:

Subsection (e) of section 8–214d of the General Statutes if "a nonprofit corporation fails to develop the project in accordance with the development plan for the project and title to the land or interests in land acquired with state financial assistance under this section vests in the state pursuant to a default, foreclosure action, deed–in–lieu of foreclosure, voluntary transfer, or other similar voluntary or compulsory action, the commissioner may, upon approval of the State Bond Commission, convey such land or interests in land to the municipality in which the land or interests in land is located. The municipality shall use the land or interests in land, or shall cause the land or interests in land to be used for, or in conjunction with, activities related to, or similar to, any program administered by the commissioner pursuant to state or federal law."

The nonprofit Creative Housing, Inc. originally acquired, under the Community Housing land Bank and Land Trust program, the former East Windsor Military Housing site on Phelps Road and created a community land trust. The sixteen individual homes were sold to moderate-income homeowners, and the land was leased to those homeowners for a nominal monthly fee.

Approximately seven years ago, the nonprofit lost the community land trust property through foreclosure, and the Town of East Windsor took over as the owner of the land, along with the private road, and utilities.

Since that time, the Town of East Windsor has been acting in the shoes of the community land trust, maintaining common space and infrastructure, and leasing the use of the property to the individual homeowners.

The Town of East Windsor, in consultation with the Department of Housing, and on behalf of the sixteen individual homeowners, are seeking a permanent solution to the ownership of this site, and is requesting approval of the State Bond Commission to formally transfer the land to the town to begin the process to effectively subdivide the property, and transfer each leased parcel to the respective homeowner.

GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND SALE

REQUESTED: Authorization to issue and sell general obligation bonds of the State in an amount not to exceed \$800,000,000

SUGGESTED RESOLUTION:

The State Treasurer is authorized to issue and sell general obligation bonds of the State, which were previously authorized to be issued by this Commission, or which may be authorized to be issued by this Commission prior to their sale, in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$800,000,000. The bonds may be issued in such form and manner that the interest thereon may be includable in or excludable from the gross income of the owners thereof for Federal income tax purposes. It is hereby found to be in the public interest if any such bonds are issued so that the interest thereon is includable in the gross income of the owners thereof.

The Treasurer is authorized to consolidate for sale bonds authorized to be issued under two or more bond acts and issue the same as one or more bond issues provided that a separate maturity schedule for the bonds authorized under each bond act shall be established and filed with the Secretary of the State Bond Commission prior to the delivery of the bonds.

The Treasurer is authorized to sell such bonds at public sale on sealed proposals or by negotiation, in such manner, at such price or prices, at such time or times, and on such terms and conditions as the Treasurer shall determine to be in the best interests of the State.

The Treasurer is authorized to enter into agreements on behalf of the State with respect to the issuance and sale of said bonds, including financial advisory agreements, bond purchase agreements, secondary market disclosure agreements, tax regulatory agreements, which may contain the provisions set forth in Section 3–20(r) of the Connecticut General Statutes if applicable, and agreements with respect to the issuance, sale and securing of such bonds.

The Treasurer is authorized to determine the form, date or dates, maturities of serial or term bonds, date and manner of sale, sinking fund or other reserve requirements, if any, interest rate or rates and due dates thereof (including the issuance of such bonds at fixed rates or variable rates, and as capital appreciation or current interest bonds), the denominations and designation of such bonds, registration, conversion and transfer privileges, the terms of redemption with or without premium, the date and manner of sale of such bonds, and all other terms and conditions of such bonds and of the issuance and sale thereof. The Treasurer is authorized to exercise such powers from time to time (including, without limitation, amending any determination as to any bonds heretofore or hereafter issued, to the extent not prohibited by the terms thereof) as the Treasurer shall determine to be in the best interests of the State, provided that the treasurer shall file a certificate of determination setting forth the details and particulars of such bonds with the Secretary of the State Bond Commission on or before the date of delivery or amendment of such bonds, the details of which were determined or amended by the Treasurer in accordance with this delegation.

The Treasurer is authorized to enter into on behalf of the State such reimbursement agreements, remarketing agreements, standby bond purchase agreements and any other necessary or appropriate agreements in connection with obtaining any liquidity facility or credit facility with respect to such bonds, and to determine the terms and conditions of any such agreement. The Treasurer may pledge the full faith and credit of the State to the State's payment obligations under any such agreement.

The Treasurer is authorized to enter into on behalf of the State such swap or other contracts with respect to such bonds and any other necessary or appropriate agreements in connection with obtaining any such contract, with such terms and conditions and parties as the Treasurer may determine, as provided in and subject to the requirements of Section 3–20a(c) of the Connecticut General Statutes. The Treasurer is authorized to pledge the full faith and credit of the State to the State's payment obligations under any such contract.

Transportation Infrastructure Purposes in an amount not to exceed \$875,000,000 (the "New Money Bonds") and Special Tax Obligation Refunding Bonds, Transportation Infrastructure Purposes in an amount not to exceed \$250,000,000 (the "Refunding Bonds"); (ii) with respect to the Refunding Bonds, authorizing the refunding at the earliest call date of certain maturities of certain outstanding issues of Special Tax Obligation Bonds and Special Tax Obligation Refunding Bonds to be determined by the Treasurer; (iii) authorizing the Governor, Treasurer, Comptroller, Secretary of the State, Attorney General, Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management and the Commissioner of the Connecticut Department of Transportation, or their duly authorized representatives, on behalf of the State, to take any and all action necessary and proper in connection with the sale, issuance and delivery of the New Money Bonds and the Refunding Bonds (collectively the "Bonds"), including, but not limited to, the execution and delivery of amendments and supplements to the Indentures, contracts of purchase, tax regulatory agreements, continuing disclosure agreements, escrow agreements, financial advisory agreements, reimbursement agreements, remarketing agreements, standby bond purchase agreements, and any other necessary or appropriate agreements in connection with obtaining any liquidity facility or credit facility with respect to such Bonds, any contracts deemed necessary or appropriate by the Treasurer to place the obligation of the State, as represented by the Bonds, on such interest rate or cash flow basis as the Treasurer shall determine, as provided in Section 3-20a (c) of the Connecticut General Statutes, and Preliminary Official Statements and Official Statements; (iv) authorizing that a portion of the proceeds of the Bonds be deposited in the Reserve Account in an amount and manner required by the Indentures and, to the extent deemed necessary by the Treasurer, that accrued interest on the Bonds be used to pay costs of issuance; and (v) delegating to the Treasurer the authority to determine the form, date or dates, maturities (including the amortization requirements of any and all term bonds), date and manner of sale or sales (including public sale on sealed proposals or by negotiated underwriting), the uses of the proceeds of the Bonds in accordance with Chapter 243 of the Connecticut General Statutes and the Indentures, interest rate or rates of the Bonds and all other terms and particulars of the Bonds, including the issuance of the Bonds as senior bonds or second lien bonds bearing fixed rate or variable rates of interest and the issuance of the Bonds as tax-exempt or taxable bonds for Federal income tax purposes, and issued with or without concomitant interest rate swaps or any other contracts authorized under Section 3-20a (c) of the Connecticut General Statutes, in such denominations and bearing such designation, registration, conversion, redemption and transfer privileges as the Treasurer shall determine to be in the best interests of the State, provided the Treasurer shall file a certificate of determination with the Secretary of the State Bond Commission on or before the date of delivery of the Bonds setting forth the details and particulars of the Bonds determined by the Treasurer in accordance with this delegation.
