# Statutory Formula Grants 

## Introduction

The purpose of this section is to provide information for the upcoming biennium with respect to certain ongoing state grant programs under which payments to municipalities are determined by statutory formulas. Although not all-inclusive, this information should help provide a general guide to proposed overall formula grant funding levels for Fiscal Years 2003-2004 and 2004-2005. Descriptions of the grant programs for which estimates are provided begin on the following page.
text that is highlighted in uppercase, boldfaced type indicates proposed legislation that WOULD SUBSTANTIVELY CHANGE THE PROGRAM REFERENCED. All lowercase, boldfaced type represents text with added emphasis. Grant estimates for Fiscal Years 2004-2005 are based on the Governor's Recommended Budget for the biennium that will begin July 1, 2003. The General Assembly may amend the legislative proposals on which these estimates are based.
Data for the current fiscal year are also included in this section. Pursuant to Section 52 of Public Act 02-1 (May 9 Special Session), appropriations for some grants were rescinded, by up to $5 \%$, and payments were proportionately reduced. The following programs were impacted by this legislation: Mashantucket Pequot and Mohegan Fund Grant, Public School Transportation, Non-Public School Transportation, Reimbursements for Exempt Machinery and Equipment, Excess Costs-Student Based, Extended School Hours, the Early Childhood Program, Priority School Districts, Early Reading Success, School-Based Health Clinics, the Drug Enforcement Program and Youth Service Bureaus. The data shown in this section reflect these reductions.

On February 28, 2003, the Governor signed into law An Act Concerning Modifications To Current And Future State Expenditures And Revenues, which made the following additional reductions to the Fiscal Year 2002-2003 appropriations for the grants specified: Mashantucket Pequot and Mohegan Fund Grant ( $\$ 21.5$ million), Town Aid Road Fund Grant ( $\$ 9$ million) and Reimbursements For Exempt Machinery And Equipment ( $\$ 12$ million). The Fiscal Year 2002-2003 data in this section reflect proportionate reductions to these grants. The December payment of $\$ 42.48$ million for the Mashantucket Pequot and Mohegan Fund Grant represented more than one-third of the total payable based on the final appropriation. As a result, the March payment for this grant will equal $\$ 28.19$ million and the June payment will equal $\$ 35.33$ million. Grant balances for Town Aid Road and Reimbursements For Exempt Machinery And Equipment will be paid as soon as possible. (See page E-5 for a summary of proposed changes to the state-reimbursed manufacturing machinery and equipment property tax exemption program.)
This legislation also altered the Fiscal Year 2002-2003 funding for Extended School Hours, the Early Childhood Program, Priority School Districts, Early Reading Success, School Based Health Clinics and the Drug Enforcement Program. The amounts shown on page E-24 reflect the final appropriation amounts.
Grantee-specific estimates for programs that were previously included in the Miscellaneous Grants category are no longer provided. The appropriations for these programs are, however, included on page $\mathrm{E}-24$, along with those for other programs for which grantee-specific estimates are not available. Descriptions of these programs appear under Additional Grants, beginning on page E-9.

Towns for which amounts are not displayed in education program columns are members of regional school districts that receive direct state funding. Grant estimates for regional school districts are shown following those for municipalities, a category that includes all Connecticut cities, towns, boroughs and the unconsolidated City of Groton. Due to rounding and the fact that payments to lesser taxing districts are not always shown, the totals for a number of columns do not exactly reflect actual or proposed state budget amounts. If a program's estimate for Fiscal Year 2004-2005 is the same as that for Fiscal Year 2003-2004, data needed to calculate the grant for the second year of the biennium are not currently available.

Please note - Section 12-62 of the Connecticut General Statutes contains the revaluation implementation schedule for Connecticut towns. Failure to implement a revaluation on the date required could result in the imposition of a penalty equal to $10 \%$ of the actual payments for the statutory formula grants that are estimated in this section.

## Grant Program Summaries

The estimates on pages E-13 through E-28 correspond to the brief grant program descriptions provided below.

## 1. STATE-OWNED REAL PROPERTY PAYMENT-IN-LIEU OF TAXES (PILOT)

Payment is made pursuant to $\S 12-19 a, \S 12-19 b, \S 12-19 c, \S 4 b-39, \S 32-666$ and Public Act 00-192. Fiscal Year 2003-2004 payments to towns and certain lesser taxing districts are based on 2001 Grand List property tax exemptions applied to state-owned real property, certain real property that is the subject of a state lease or longterm financing contract, municipally owned airports and certain land held in trust by the federal government. Fiscal Year 2004-2005 payments are based upon 2002 Grand List tax exemptions for these properties. The portion of property tax loss payable by the state is determined by various factors, including a property's use. Property uses and corresponding PILOT percentages are:
(1) State prison facilities used for incarcerative purposes in the fiscal year prior to that in which payment is remitted - 100\% PILOT;
(2) That portion of the John Dempsey Hospital used as a permanent medical ward for prisoners - 100\% PILOT;
(3) All state-owned property in any town in which more than $50 \%$ of the property within its boundaries is owned by the State of Connecticut - 100\% PILOT
(4) The Long Lane School and the Connecticut Juvenile Training School - 100\% PILOT;
(5) All other real property owned by the State of Connecticut, certain real property (such as the Superior Court in Middletown) described in §4b-39 and municipally-owned airports - 45\% PILOT;
(6) Land designated under the 1983 settlement boundary and taken into trust by the federal government for the Mashantucket Pequot Tribal Nation on or after June 8, 1999 - 100\% PILOT; and
(7) The Connecticut Valley Hospital - 65\% PILOT.

Notwithstanding the above provisions, the Fiscal Year 2003-2004 PILOT to the Town of Preston for property formerly used as the Norwich State Hospital is \$147,056, pursuant to Section 25 of Public Act 00-192.

Since payments are subject to the state's audit of exempt assessments, the Fiscal Year 2003-2004 PILOT may reflect adjustments resulting from modifications related to the 2000 Grand List, and the PILOT for Fiscal Year 2004-2005 may reflect 2001 Grand List adjustments. Formula-generated totals are reduced proportionately to the amount of the appropriation. THE RECOMMENDED APPROPRIATION FOR FISCAL YEARS 2003-2004 AND 20042005 IS THE SAME AS THAT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2002-2003.

Grant is paid on September 30th.

## 2. PRIVATE COLLEGES AND GENERAL AND FREE STANDING CHRONIC DISEASE HOSPITALS PILOT

Payment is made in accordance with $\S 12-20 a$ and $\S 12-20 b$. The Fiscal Year 2003-2004 PILOT to towns and certain lesser taxing districts is calculated at $77 \%$ of their tax losses due to real property exemptions for eligible private colleges and general and free standing chronic disease hospitals on the 2001 Grand List. In Fiscal Year 2004-2005, the $77 \%$ PILOT calculation is based on tax losses due to 2002 Grand List exemptions for such properties.

Since payments are subject to the state's audit of exempt assessments, the Fiscal Year 2003-2004 PILOT may reflect 2000 Grand List adjustments and the PILOT for Fiscal Year 2004-2005 may reflect 2001 Grand List adjustments. Formula-generated totals are reduced proportionately to the amount of the appropriation. THE RECOMMENDED APPROPRIATION FOR FISCAL YEARS 2003-2004 AND 2004-2005 IS THE SAME AS THAT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2002-2003.

Grant is paid on September $30^{\text {th }}$.

## 3. MASHANTUCKET PEQUOT AND MOHEGAN FUND GRANT

Payment is made pursuant to $\S 3-55 i$ i, $\S 3-55 j$ and $\S 3-55$ k. A total of $\$ 135,000,000$ can be annually remitted to towns from the proceeds of the Mashantucket Pequot and Mohegan Fund. Grant calculations are based on various statutory formulas. Each formula-generated total is prorated to the allocated amount. If the combined total for all formulas exceeds the total appropriation, payments are proportionately reduced. The grant calculation formulas are:
(1) $\$ 20$ million on the basis of the State-Owned Real Property PILOT program -- in Fiscal Years 2003-2004 and 2004-2005, the amount for each town is calculated at one-third of the difference between what is
received as a PILOT (excluding prior year adjustments) in the corresponding fiscal years, and what would have been received if the State-Owned Real Property PILOT program for those years had been funded at $\$ 85,205,085$. After required minimum payments are reflected, town-specific amounts are prorated to $\$ 20$ million;
(2) $\$ 20.1$ million on the basis of the PILOT for Private Colleges and General and Free Standing Chronic Disease Hospitals -- in Fiscal Years 2003-2004 and 2004-2005, the percentage of each town's PILOT (excluding prior year adjustments) to the total PILOT for all towns for the corresponding fiscal year is calculated. The percentage factor for each town is then multiplied by the $\$ 20,123,916$ allocated for this portion of the formula;
(3) $\$ 35$ million on the basis of the Property Tax Relief Fund formula in $\S 7-528$, as modified by $\S 3-55 \mathrm{j}(\mathrm{e})$;
(4) $\$ 5.475$ million to certain Distressed Municipalities on the basis of said Property Tax Relief Fund formula;

Note: Regardless of the formulas in (1) through (4) above, the amounts allocated to 28 towns are specifically set forth in $\S 3-55 \mathrm{j}(\mathrm{g})$.
(5) An additional $\$ 500,000$ to Ledyard, Montville, North Stonington, Norwich and Preston, pursuant to §355j(i); and
(6) An additional $\$ 47,500,000$ to all towns, distributed pro rata on the basis of each town's grant determined under (1) to (5) above, to the total of all such grants, pursuant to §3-55j(j).

## PROPOSED LEGISLATION CALLS FOR MORE RECENT POPULATION, PER CAPITA INCOME AND EQUALIZED NET GRAND LIST DATA TO BE USED IN THE FORMULA CALCULATIONS UNDER (3) AND (4), COMMENCING WITH FISCAL YEAR 2003-2004. THE RECOMMENDED APPROPRIATION IS \$85 MILLION FOR FISCAL YEARS 2003-2004 AND 2004-2005, which will result in a proration of grants to the total amount available.

A town must share the grant determined under certain formulas described above with an eligible special services district located within its boundaries. Although the estimates in this section reflect the total grant payable to towns that are subject to this requirement, they receive a separate notice of the amount they must remit to these eligible special services districts. Also, in accordance with §22a-27j, the Office of Policy and Management must deduct from the $1^{\text {st }}$ Mashantucket Pequot and Mohegan Fund Grant payment issued to a town in any fiscal year, the amount that the town owes to the Environmental Quality Fund. These deductions are not reflected in the amounts shown.

Grant is paid in three installments on December $31^{\text {st }}$, March $31^{\text {st }}$ and June $30^{\text {th }}$.

## 4. TOWN AID ROAD FUND GRANT

Payment is made pursuant to §13a-175a through §13a-175g, inclusive, and §13a-175i. Among the factors used to determine grant payments are a municipality's population and the number of improved and unimproved roads within its jurisdiction. Grants are used for various purposes, including the construction and maintenance of public highways, roads, and bridges. Formula-generated totals are prorated to the appropriation. TWELVE AND ONE HALF MILLION DOLLARS IS RECOMMENDED AS THE APPROPRIATION FOR FISCAL YEARS 2003-2004 AND 20042005.

Fifty percent of the grant is paid in July or August; the balance is usually paid in January.

## 5. LOCAL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT (LOCIP) PROGRAM

Payment is made in accordance with §7-535 through §7-538, inclusive. Each municipality receives reimbursement of up to the amount of its formula-generated entitlement after certification that an approved project (or a portion thereof) has been completed. LoCIP entitlements do not lapse. Unused entitlements from previous years are added to those calculated for the current fiscal year, which (except as described below) are accessible to municipalities on March $1^{\text {st }}$. The estimates in this section are the annual entitlements, not the cumulative amounts available.

Estimates for Fiscal Years 2003-2004 and 2004-2005 are based on data for Fiscal Year 2002-2003 and actual entitlements for the upcoming biennium may differ from the estimates shown. Also, Public Act 02-5 (May 9 Special Session) postponed the issuance of state bonds for this program for one year. Although no municipality will suffer a loss of reimbursement as a result of this provision, payments may be delayed. Project approval can be issued, however, against a municipality's postponed entitlement.
No reimbursement can be issued unless it is requested within seven years of a project's approval date, although a waiver of this provision may be granted under terms and conditions the Office of Policy and Management deems appropriate.

Except as noted above, grant is paid upon receipt of certification that an approved project (or a portion thereof)
has been completed, if such certification is received within seven years of the project's approval date.

## 6. PUBLIC SCHOOL PUPIL TRANSPORTATION

Payment is made pursuant to $\S 10-54, \S 10-66 e \mathrm{e}, ~ § 10-97, \S 10-158 \mathrm{a}, \S 10-266 \mathrm{~m}, \S 10-273 \mathrm{a}$ and $\S 10-277$. Grants are determined by local wealth, based on the ranking of each district's Adjusted Equalized Net Grand List Per Capita (AENGLC). Each of the wealthiest seventeen towns is assigned a reimbursement percentage of zero; the remaining districts are each assigned a percentage between zero and 60 . Secondary and K-12 regional districts receive a 5 and 10 percentage point bonus, respectively. No local or regional board of education can receive an entitlement of less than $\$ 1,000$.

Since estimates are based on projected local expenditures, actual grant revenue may vary significantly from the published estimates. THE RECOMMENDED APPROPRIATION FOR FISCAL YEARS 2003-2004 AND 20042005 IS THE SAME AS THE FISCAL YEAR 2002-2003 EXPENDITURE AMOUNT.

Grant is usually paid in April.

## 7. NON-PUBLIC SCHOOL PUPIL TRANSPORTATION

Payment is made pursuant to $\S 10-266 \mathrm{~m}, ~ § 10-277$ and $\S 10-281$. Grant determinations are determined by local wealth, based on the ranking of each district's Adjusted Equalized Net Grand List Per Capita (AENGLC). Each of the wealthiest seventeen towns is assigned a reimbursement percentage of zero; the remaining districts are each assigned a percentage between zero and 60. Non-public school pupil transportation expenditures subject to reimbursement are capped at twice the per pupil public expenditure from the year prior to the expenditure year.

Since estimates are based on projected local expenditures, actual grant revenue may vary significantly from the published estimates. THE RECOMMENDED APPROPRIATION FOR FISCAL YEARS 2003-2004 AND 20042005 IS THE SAME AS THE FISCAL YEAR 2002-2003 EXPENDITURE AMOUNT.

Grant is usually paid in April.

## 8. ADULT EDUCATION

Payment is made pursuant to $\S 10-71$ and $\S 10-71$ a. Adult education expenditures are reimbursed in the current year on a sliding scale of $0 \%$ to $65 \%$, based on local wealth (AENGLC). Districts identified under $\S 10-266 \mathrm{p}(\mathrm{a})$ as Priority School Districts (i.e., those with the largest numbers or highest percentages of poor and remedial students) cannot receive a percentage of less than 20.

Since estimates are based on projected local expenditures, actual grant revenue may vary significantly from the published estimates. THE RECOMMENDED APPROPRIATION FOR FISCAL YEARS 2003-2004 AND 20042005 IS THE SAME AS THE FISCAL YEAR 2002-2003 EXPENDITURE AMOUNT.
$66 \%$ of the grant is paid by August $31^{\text {st }}$ and the balance is paid by May $31^{\text {st }}$.
9. EDUCATION COST SHARING (ECS)

Payment is made pursuant to §10-262f through §10-262j, inclusive. The ECS formula provides aid to towns based on:
(1) Town wealth, determined $50 \%$ by Equalized Net Grand List per weighted student and $50 \%$ by Equalized Net Grand List per capita, adjusted to reflect each town's per capita and median household incomes;
(2) A State Guaranteed Wealth Level (SGWL) set at 1.55 times median town wealth;
(3) A foundation amount set at $\$ 5,891$ per need student; and
(4) Each town's need student count, comprised of its resident students, plus $1 / 4$ of its Temporary Family Assistance (TFA) count, plus $1 / 4$ of its mastery count, plus $1 / 10$ of its count of Limited English Proficient (LEP) students not funded pursuant to §10-17f. For purposes of determining each town's need student count, TFA counts are frozen at Fiscal Year 1996-1997 levels.
(5) In addition to its base aid ratio determined by town wealth, as noted above (wherein no town can receive an aid ratio that is less than 6\%) each town is eligible for a supplemental aid ratio of up to $4 \%$ times the foundation amount, times the portion of need student count driven by TFA, mastery count and extended school year weighting. The supplemental aid ratio is based on TFA counts and the percentage of students performing below the remedial standard on the statewide mastery test.

A town cannot receive more than a $6 \%$ increase above its ECS base revenue (total ECS entitlement less the supplements for density, cap relief and guaranteed minimum grant increases as described below), nor can it receive less than its previous year's base revenue. The actual rate of increase (or growth cap) up to the prescribed
maximum is determined by town wealth. Pursuant to $\S 10-262 \mathrm{f}$, the regional district membership bonus is $\$ 100$ per student adjusted for the number of regional grades.

For Fiscal Year 2002-2003, districts with population density in excess of the state average receive a density grant based on their need student counts, times their foundation amounts, times their density aid ratios. The density supplement is calculated after the grant cap or stoploss provisions have been applied to the base ECS formula. Districts cannot receive less than their previous year's density grant.

Priority School Districts and Transitional School Districts (i.e., districts that are not Priority School Districts but that have large numbers or high percentages of poor and remedial students) cannot receive a base ECS entitlement, excluding density, that is less than $70 \%$ and $40 \%$, respectively, of their current year's formula aid (ECS aid unadjusted for density and the grant cap and stoploss provisions), nor can a Priority School District receive a grant that is below its previous year's grant per resident student level.

Towns impacted by the ECS grant cap receive a proportional share of an additional $\$ 50,000,000$ above their base revenues plus density supplements as described above. Actual revenues may vary from the published estimates due to data changes resulting from audits.

For Fiscal Years 2003-2004 and 2004-2005, a town's Minimum Expenditure Requirement (MER) equals its prior year's MER adjusted by the change in the town's ECS grant from the prior year, and further adjusted to reflect decreases in enrollment, as provided by $\S 10-262 \mathrm{j}$. A town's MER is adjusted downward if there is a drop in resident students. The MER is adjusted by $50 \%$ of the foundation amount for each such student.

PROPOSED LEGISLATION ELIMINATES THE DENSITY SUPPLEMENT FOR FISCAL YEARS 2003-2004 AND 20042005. THE ECS GRANT INCREASE CAP OF 6\% WILL CONTINUE DURING THE UPCOMING BIENNIUM, AS WILL THE \$50 MILLION SUPPLEMENT TO TOWNS THAT ARE IMPACTED BY THE CAP.

IN FISCAL YEARS 2003-2004 AND 2004-2005, HOWEVER, EACH TOWN'S ECS ENTITLEMENT WILL BE REDUCED BY 3\%. GRANTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2004-2005 WILL BE FURTHER REDUCED TO THE FISCAL YEAR 2003-2004 ENTITLEMENT LEVEL. THE RECOMMENDED APPROPRIATION OF \$1.488 BILLION FOR EACH OF THESE FISCAL YEARS REFLECTS THESE PROPOSED CHANGES.
$25 \%$ of the grant is paid by October $31^{\text {st }} ; 25 \%$ is paid by January $31^{\text {st }}$ and the balance is paid by April $30^{\text {th }}$.

## Additional Grants

The annual appropriations for each of the grant programs described below appear on page E-24. Grantee-specific estimates are not available for these programs.

## REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXEMPT MACHINERY AND EQUIPMENT

Payment is made in accordance with §12-81(72), §12-94b and §12-94c. In Fiscal Year 2003-2004, municipalities are reimbursed for the revenue loss they sustain due to property tax exemptions granted for eligible manufacturing machinery and equipment on the 2002 Grand List. Fiscal Year 2004-2005 payments are based on 2003 Grand List exemptions. Payments remitted in any year may reflect adjustments resulting from modifications to a prior year's reimbursement.

PROPOSED LEGISLATION REMOVES EXEMPTION ELIGIBILITY, AS OF OCTOBER 1, 2002, FOR ALL COMMERCIAL VEHICLES (INCLUDING TRUCKS FOR HIRE) AND FOR MACHINERY AND EQUIPMENT USED IN PROCESSING AND IN THE PRODUCTION OF MOTION PICTURES, VIDEOS, AND SOUND RECORDINGS. THIS LEGISLATION ALLOWS MUNICIPALITIES TO ISSUE TAX BILLS IN FISCAL YEAR 2003-2004 TO RECOUP TAX REVENUE DUE TO EXEMPTION REMOVALS.

FOR ASSESSMENT YEARS COMMENCING ON AND AFTER OCTOBER 1, 2003, THE EXEMPTION UNDER §12-81(72) WILL BE AVAILABLE ONLY WITH RESPECT TO NEW MACHINERY AND EQUIPMENT USED BY THOSE PRIMARILY ENGAGED IN MANUFACTURING OR BIOTECHNOLOGY.
THIS LEGISLATION ALSO REDUCES THE STATE'S REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXEMPT MACHINERY AND EQUIPMENT TO 65\% OF A MUNICIPALITY'S TAX LOSS AND ALLOWS PAYMENTS TO BE PROPORTIONATELY REDUCED, IF NECESSARY, TO THE AMOUNT OF THE APPROPRIATION. THE RECOMMENDED APPROPRIATIONS FOR 2003-2004 AND 2004-2005 REFLECT THESE PROPOSED CHANGES IN EXEMPTION ELIGIBILITY AND THE REIMBURSEMENT LEVEL.

Grant is usually paid on December $31^{\text {st }}$.

## EXCESS COSTS-STUDENT BASED GRANT

Payment is made pursuant to $\S 10-76 \mathrm{~d}(\mathrm{e}), \S 10-76 \mathrm{~g}(\mathrm{a}), \S 10-76 \mathrm{~g}(\mathrm{~b})$ and $\S 10-253$. With respect to state agency initiated placements, the state funds $100 \%$ of the costs of these placements in excess of the district's prior year net current expenditure per pupil (NCEP). Pursuant to §10-76g(a)(1) and §10$76 \mathrm{~d}(\mathrm{e})(3)$, the state pays $100 \%$ of the current year cost for certain no nexus students and special education students who reside on state property.

In Fiscal Year 2002-2003, these programs support costs in excess of five times a town's prior year's average cost per pupil for students placed in a special education program by a school district. THE RECOMMENDED APPROPRIATION FOR FISCAL YEARS 2003-2004 AND 2004-2005 IS THE SAME AS THE FISCAL YEAR 2002-2003 EXPENDITURE AMOUNT. PURSUANT TO PROPOSED LEGISLATION, THE REIMBURSEMENT PERCENTAGE WILL REMAIN AT 5\% OF A TOWN'S PRIOR YEAR AVERAGE COST PER PUPIL.
$75 \%$ of this grant is paid in March and the balance is paid in May.

## SCHOOL-BASED CHILD HEALTH

Payment is made pursuant to $\S 10-76 d(a)$. Grants are remitted to those local and regional boards of education that voluntarily determine the Medicaid eligibility of their special education students and furnish the information the Department of Social Services needs to obtain federal reimbursement for certain services that eligible students receive. Among these are physical, occupational and speech therapies, mental health services, nursing, and the provision of medical supplies and specialized transportation.

For Fiscal Year 2002-2003, 60\% of the amount received from the federal government is remitted to local and regional boards of education. Grants can be made on an estimated basis and grantees are required to reimburse the state if they receive an amount in excess of that to which they are entitled. PROPOSED LEGISLATION CALLS FOR THE STATE TO REMIT 50\% OF THE AMOUNT RECEIVED FROM THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT TO LOCAL AND REGIONAL BOARDS OF EDUCATION, COMMENCING IN FISCAL YEAR 20032004. THE RECOMMENDED APPROPRIATIONS OF $\$ 6.25$ MILLION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2003-2004 AND $\$ 6.65$ MILLION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2004-2005 REFLECT THE PROPOSED CHANGE IN THE REIMBURSEMENT LEVEL. These appropriation amounts also reflects changes required due to rate restructuring.

Grant is paid at least quarterly.
EXTENDED SCHOOL HOURS GRANT
Payment is made in accordance with $\S 10-266 t, \S 10-266$ p and $\S 10-266 u$. Maintained as a separate component of the Priority School District Grant, this program allows an expansion of the number of schools in Priority School Districts that can be kept open for academic enrichment and recreational programs after school hours, on Saturdays and during vacations.

Payments are calculated by multiplying the appropriation by the ratio of each Priority School District's average daily membership to the total average daily membership of all such districts.

THE RECOMMENDED APPROPRIATION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2003-2004 IS \$2.95 MILLION. THE FISCAL YEAR 2004-2005 GRANT WILL BE CAPPED AT THE EXPENDITURE LEVEL FOR FISCAL YEAR 2003-2004.

Grant is paid monthly upon approval.

## EARLY CHILDHOOD PROGRAM

Payment is made in accordance with $\S 10-160, \S 10-16 p, \S 10-16 \mathrm{q}, ~ § 10-16 \mathrm{r}$ and $\S 10-266 \mathrm{p}$. Ninety-three percent of the program's annual appropriation is provided to current and former Priority School Districts, a small portion is used for administrative purposes and the remainder is available, on a competitive basis, to other eligible school districts. This program is designed to initiate and expand pre-Kindergarten programs in current and former Priority School Districts and in schools where at least $40 \%$ of lunches are served free or at a reduced price.

The Early Childhood Program Grant component related to Priority School Districts is maintained and distributed as a separate component of the Priority School District Grant. The portion of the Early Childhood Program Grant related to schools where $40 \%$ of lunches are served free is also distributed as a separate grant.

THE RECOMMENDED APPROPRIATION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2003-2004 IS \$40.1 MILLION. THE FISCAL YEAR 2004-2005 GRANT WILL BE CAPPED AT THE EXPENDITURE LEVEL FOR FISCAL YEAR 2003-2004.

Grant is paid monthly upon approval.

Payment is made in accordance with $\S 10-266$ aa to encourage interdistrict attendance between the cities and suburbs. Participating suburban districts receive $\$ 2,000$ for each city student they admit, and city districts receive $\$ 2,000$ for each student they receive from the suburbs. Both the sending and receiving districts equally share the credit for these students for those state grants that use resident students or average daily membership data.

THE RECOMMENDED APPROPRIATIONS FOR FISCAL YEARS 2003-2004 AND 2004-2005 REFLECT INCREASES OF APPROXIMATELY \$330,000 AND $\$ 2$ MILLION, RESPECTIVELY, OVER THE APPROPRIATION FOR THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR.

Grant is scheduled to be paid by December.
PRIORITY SCHOOL DISTRICTS
Payment is made pursuant to $\S 10-266$ p. This program recently absorbed the following grants: Early Childhood, School Accountability, Early Reading Success and Extended School Hours. These components of the Priority School District Grant are separately maintained and distributed. Among the factors used to determine grant amounts are population, mastery test scores and a high percentage of TFA students.

Pursuant to $\S 10-266 p(b)$, phase-out funding is provided to those districts that lost their eligibility during the most recently concluded biennium. THE RECOMMENDED APPROPRIATION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2003-2004 IS $\mathbf{\$ 1 9}$ MILLION. THE FISCAL YEAR 2004-2005 GRANT WILL BE CAPPED AT THE EXPENDITURE LEVEL FOR FISCAL YEAR 2003-2004.

Grant is paid monthly upon approval.
EARLY READING SUCCESS
Payment is made pursuant to $\S 10-265 f, \S 10-265 \mathrm{~h}, \S 10-265 \mathrm{j}$ and $\S 10-266$ p. This program is intended to improve the reading skills of students in Kindergarten to Grade 3, inclusive, in Priority School Districts and in those towns with elementary schools that serve at least $40 \%$ of their lunches free or at a reduced price. Grants under this program are maintained and distributed as separate components of the Priority School District Grant.

Approximately $90 \%$ of the program's annual appropriation is provided to current and former Priority School Districts and $9 \%$ is available, on a competitive basis, to the other eligible school districts. (The remainder of the appropriation is used for administrative purposes.) Funding is also available for the two early childhood learning programs established under §10-265j. THE RECOMMENDED APPROPRIATION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2003-2004 IS $\mathbf{\$ 1 9 . 8}$ MILLION. THE FISCAL YEAR 2004-2005 GRANT WILL BE CAPPED AT THE EXPENDITURE LEVEL FOR FISCAL YEAR 2003-2004.

Grant is paid monthly upon approval.

## MAGNET SCHOOLS

Pursuant to $\S 10-2641$, funding is provided for the operation of interdistrict magnet schools and for transportation to out-of-town magnet schools. Districts receive $100 \%$ of the cost of such transportation, capped at $\$ 1,200$ per student. Any transportation costs not covered under this program are subject to reimbursement under the Public School Transportation Grant.
In Fiscal Year 2002-2003, there were 32 interdistrict magnet schools. At least 33 such schools are currently operating and more are expected to commence operation in the near future. THE RECOMMENDED APPROPRIATIONS FOR FISCAL YEARS 2003-2004 AND 2004-2005 REFLECT INCREASES OF $\$ 14.5$ AND $\$ 28.3$ MILLION, RESPECTIVELY, OVER THE APPROPRIATION FOR THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR.
$50 \%$ of the grant is paid by September1 ${ }^{\text {st }}$ and the balance is paid by January $1^{\text {st }}$.

## SCHOOL YEAR ACCOUNTABILITY

Payment is made pursuant to $\S 10-223 a$ and $\S 10-266$ p. This grant, which is maintained as a separate component of the Priority School District Grant, assists school children in Priority School Districts by allowing additional instruction to be provided to those students whose mastery test scores indicate that such instruction is needed.

THE RECOMMENDED APPROPRIATION FOR FISCAL YEARS 2003-2004 AND 2004-2005 IS THE SAME AS THE FISCAL YEAR 2002-2003 EXPENDITURE AMOUNT.

Grant is paid monthly upon approval.
YOUTH SERVICE BUREAUS
Payment is made pursuant to $\S 10-19 \mathrm{~m}$ through $\S 10-19 \mathrm{p}$, inclusive. THE RECOMMENDED APPROPRIATION FOR FISCAL YEARS 2003-2004 AND 2004-2005 IS THE SAME AS THE FISCAL YEAR 2002-2003 EXPENDITURE AMOUNT.

Grant is paid quarterly.
DRUG ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM
Payment is made pursuant to pursuant to $\S 21 \mathrm{a}-274 \mathrm{a}(\mathrm{a})$ and regulations thereunder. THE RECOMMENDED APPROPRIATION WITH RESPECT TO THE ENTITLEMENT PORTION OF THIS PROGRAM IS $\mathbf{\$ 1 . 8 5}$ MILLION FOR THE UPCOMING BIENNIUM.

Grant is paid upon approval by the Office of Policy and Management.

## CHILD DAY CARE

Child Day Care Grants are issued pursuant to §8-210. THE RECOMMENDED APPROPRIATION FOR FISCAL YEARS 2003-2004 AND 2004-2005 IS THE SAME AS THAT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2002-2003.

Grant is paid upon approval of the Commissioner of the Department of Social Services.
VESSELS' PILOT
The Payment-In-Lieu of Taxes for Vessels is made pursuant to $\S 15-155$ b. THE RECOMmENDED APPROPRIATION FOR FISCAL YEARS 2003-2004 AND 2004-2005 IS THE SAME AS THAT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2002-2003.

Grant is paid in December.

## SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH CLINICS
