Transfer DVA IT to DAS BEST

ASSOCIATED PROGRAMS:

DESCRIPTION & REASON

As a cost saving/ consolidation initiative with the State moving to a new Data Center and the redundancy of having an IT Department without a fully integrated EMR to support the mission of the DVA - it is our fiscal recommendation that we transfer our IT division to DAS/ BEST.

Based upon the recent DAS/BEST Assessment and Recommendation report dated 9/13/12, the Agency will transfer mission critical services to BEST which will includes servers/hardware and directory services, and then the telecom/phone system to the new State Data Center. DVA will also transfer the IT personnel to DAS/BEST which includes (1) IT Manager, (1) Technical Analyst 4, (1) Technical Analyst 3, (2) Technical Analyst 2.

This consolidation will also save the Agency on the costs of re-building DVA's data center which will need to be relocated out of current location/building -- According to BEST report, the estimated cost of re-build/relocate DVA data centerto another DVA location/building will cost approximately \$500,000. (Note: The relocation costs were not estimated in the original submission of the biennium due to a late assessment report which came out after the submission.)

Pursue VHA Directive 2011-035 to have VA pay medications for eligible veterans

DESCRIPTION & REASON

VHA Directive 2011-035 was released on September 14, 2011 to clarify Section 211 of Public Law 109-461 -- it provides medications for eligible veterans residing in DVA State Veterans Home.

The Agency has brought this Directive to the attention of the Veterans Administration in Connecticut and is planning to schedule a meeting to implement this directive.

In FY12, the Agency spent \$672,798 on Drugs & Pharmaceuticals, though not all veterans in the healthcare facility will qualify to receive medications from VA, the Agency estimates if the Directive fully implemented, the Agency should recieve approximately \$300,000 a year for the reimbursement of eligible veterans' Drugs & Pharmaceutical expenditures.
