Agency Title:

Credentialed Court Ordered Evaluations #1 Priority

Agency Description:

DCF is responsible for paying for court ordered psychological evaluations. Because the process for ordering, approving, and paying for these evaluations required the interaction of three state agencies, CSSD, OAG and DCF, DCF had a contract with a third party for quality assurance activities. The third party charged 8% of the payments managed. Several years ago an advocate was concerned that DCF paying for these evaluations might have some impact on the findings so it was requested that DCF be removed from the process. This complaint was considered by the OAG and it was decided that DCF would no longer pay the third party quality assurance provider that managed the payments. Instead the providers would work directly with DCF. While managed by the third party the annual cost of these evaluations was \$325,000 annually. In the first partial year without this oversight, SFY09, the cost increased to \$524,234. The average spent annually from SFY2011 to 2014 has been \$2,500,000. CSSD has contacted DCF to address concerns with how this process has changed. DCF would like to once again put the quality assurance provider back in place. DCF would like to work with CSSD, OAG and the providers to return to the QA activities and standards employed that produced better reports and cost containment.

Agency Title:

Central Transportation Unit Priority #2

Agency Description:

DCF estimates it provided over 60,000 vehicle transports in SFY14 costing the State approximately \$9.2M. The need for transportation continues to grow due to new federal requirements and state legislation. The Department has been studying the most efficient way to provide this service and we have determined that developing a Central Transportation Unit, similar to other State agencies would be the safest, most cost effective way to provide this service. The Department would centralize a unit of drivers that would receive their schedules from a central dispatcher, grouping rides for 14 area offices and 3 institutions. DCF would use dispatch software, have dispatchers schedule trips and drivers. The Department would garage vehicles centrally in depots throughout the state. Social Workers would submit transport needs into the software and would group trips and create schedules.

Agency Title:

Change on Investigations with No Finding Priority # 3

Agency Description:

The Department receives approximately 50,000 reports of child abuse and neglect annually. Many of these reports do not meet the statutory requirement for acceptance. The accepted reports are transferred to an Area Office for investigation. An investigation should not take longer than 45 days to complete, with the agency average being 43 days. The investigation is a several step process that includes a case planning function that reads the case for transfer into on-going services once the investigation is complete. Of the reports that do meet the statutory requirement that are investigated, the investigator knows within 10 days that there was no basis for the report and the report will not be substantiated but due to the requirements of the regulation, the investigator will need to process all the steps of the investigation set forth in regulation before closure. DCF is proposing a regulation change that would allow for the closure of investigation cases based on specific criteria when it is known that there was no basis for the initial report. The Department believes this would impact 10% of all reports moved to investigations, or 1,750 cases annually.

Reunifying Families with Housing RAPs Priority #4

Agency Description:

DCF has approximately 900 families on a waitlist for housing services. This number has grown from 500 two years ago. Of the 900 families on the waitlist, there are 200 that could be reunified if they had stable housing. There are many costs associated with maintaining and open case on the caseload and other supports offered to the family that would no longer be necessary if the family could be reunified and come off DCF's caseload. DCF is requesting an additional 200 Housing RAPs be issued to DCF involved families that could be reunified.

Revamp Voluntary Services Priority #5

Agency Description:

The Department has approximately 440 cases committed through Voluntary Services. These are families that have treatment services needs for Behavioral Health issues. DCF provides a payment mechanism for the family to acquire services. DCF does not provide treatment directly adding little value to the service. There are significant costs to the state maintaining these cases on the DCF caseload. DCF proposes these cases being referred to 211 and the private provider network that provides the actually treatment directly. The Department proposes building a robust Care Management Entities to be accessed by the general public in need of child mental and behavioral health services as recommended in the comprehensive report recommended by the Committee overseeing the implementation of PA 13-178.
