Subject: Fiscal Year (FY) 2017 Technical Adjustments

As requested, the Department of Transportation (Department) has reviewed its FY 2017 Appropriations Budget to determine if technical adjustments are required. We have identified critical areas where the Department is required to provide services that are unfunded, and where reallocation of funds within the existing budget will only result in the elimination of services in other essential areas. Included in the list below are items where additional positions are required to handle new requirements and several workforce development initiatives that the Department believes are vital in order to successfully ramp-up existing resources to meet the challenges of implementing the "Let's Go CT" Transportation plan legislated in the 2015 session.

- Rail Operations: Additional funds are required in the Rail Operations appropriation to fund on-going Metro North safety and maintenance initiatives to continue to maintain compliance with federally mandated safety regulations. The Department anticipates the required funding amount may be updated in the coming months when new budget forecast information is presented by Metro North.
  - \$8,300,000 in Rail Operations funding
- Chloride Materials for Snow/Ice Removal: Other Expenses funding of \$70,000 is required to fund the purchase of the average annual gallons of liquid chlorides to be used for snow and ice operations, consistent with application practices deemed necessary to ensure our state highways are kept safe, and based on the expected price per gallon. These funds are required to ensure the procurement of a sufficient amount of materials for timely response to winter weather, enabling the Department to effectively maintain the state highway system during winter storms.

\$70,000 in Other Expenses funding

- <u>Contractual Winter/Emergency Meals</u>: Additional funds are required to cover the payment of contractual meal allowances for eligible employees performing winter/emergency work, based on costs for an average winter season.

  \$200,000 in Other Expenses funding
- <u>Bus Service Operations</u>: Funds are required for the annualization of operating costs associated with bus services to begin in 2016 between Waterbury and Torrington. \$200,000 in Bus Operations funding
- <u>Concessions/Service Plaza Oversight Positions</u>: Additional staff is required to perform inspections and concessions contract oversight for the 23 newly renovated Service Plaza facilities, due to the significant increase in the number of food and retail venues, which have essentially tripled.

\$119,012 in Personal Services funding for two positions

• Positions for the Inspection of Railroad Traffic Signals: Two additional positions are required in the Bureau of Highway Operations to perform annual comprehensive inspections of traffic signals with railroad pre-emption phasing, (as recommended by Federal Railroad Administration Safety Advisory 2010-12) to enhance public safety by decreasing the risk potential (to railroad users and motoring public) for crashes due to malfunction. The scheduled inspection of railroad pre-emption systems has not been performed in the past. Minimal state funds will be required for this request, as Federal Highway Administration has approved the obligation of federal funds for this purpose. Of note, this item represents one of many federal safety recommendations/mandates that may require additional resources to implement.

\$22,505 in Pay-As-You-Go Transportation Projects funding

- Environmental Compliance Minor Capital Program: Additional funds are required to address replacement of fuel tank components that are essential to ensuring compliance with Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) environmental regulations, at 15 locations, at a cost of \$15,000 per location. \$225,000 in Minor Capital funding
- <u>Funding for PC's and Software Licensing</u>: Funds are required for additional personal computers, as well as software licensing and maintenance agreements, for the additional positions authorized for the Department in the enacted budget (P.A. 15-244) for the Let's Go CT Transportation ramp-up plan.

\$110,000 in Other Expenses/Equipment funding

• Reconfigure Daycare into Office Space for New Positions: Funds are required to complete the reconfiguration of space at the Department's Headquarters facility, previously utilized for a privately-run daycare, to be used for office space in order to help

accommodate additional positions authorized in P.A. 15-244 for the Let's Go CT Transportation ramp-up plan.

\$565,000 in Minor Capital funding

• Recruitment Program: Strong recruitment efforts are critical to the success of the Let's Go CT transportation ramp-up plan, which includes authorization for 163 additional Department positions in the enacted budget (P.A. 15-244). In order to ensure outreach efforts continually provide for broad applicant pools that result in a diversified workforce of the most highly qualified engineering and professional positions, the Department must have an aggressive and competitive recruitment program that includes increased representation and participation at college career fairs, improved reference materials to job-seekers, and a more a robust, professional and technology-forward presence.

\$10,000 in Other Expenses funding

• Cooperative Education Intern (Co-Op) Program: In order to effectively administer the "Let's Go CT" transportation ramp-up plan and corresponding increase in the number of Department positions authorized in the enacted biennial budget, additional funds are required for a Cooperative Education Intern (Co-Op) program, to serve as a competitive recruitment tool to interest top students in transportation careers with the Department, and to attract a steady, qualified candidate pool for future employment. It is imperative that the Department administer an ongoing Co-Op Program in order to provide a continuous recruitment pool; to facilitate the training of potential permanent employees; and to supplement our full-time staff in a cost-effective manner while we recruit new candidates for employment. This program will better position the Department to administer long-term transportation initiatives, help address the pending inevitable attrition of one-third of its workforce, and also serve to strengthen the Department's collaborative employment efforts with UCONN as well as other state schools. Annual funding in Personal Services of \$211,200 supports forty (40) internships per semester, as much of the work performed will be eligible to be charged to project (Federal/Bond) funds

\$211,200 in Personal Services funding

• Training Program: Funds are required for increased agency-wide training to facilitate strong state employee workforce development efforts. With the authorization for additional Department positions in the enacted budget (P.A. 15-244) for the Let's Go CT Transportation ramp-up plan, it is crucial that employees be trained promptly and consistently in order to facilitate successful implementation of Let's Go CT, as well as other Department initiatives. Strategic Training Plan templates that outline requirements for each title/bureau are being developed to document training needs for all existing and future employees. Funds of \$100,000 in Other Expenses would enable the Department's Training Division to conduct and/or hire contractors with appropriate expertise to provide structured and specialized training, ensuring that all employees receive the necessary

training specific to their jobs, and better prepare them for the challenges of implementing the Let's Go CT transportation initiative in the coming years.

\$100,000 in Other Expenses funding

Lastly, ongoing discussions have recognized that additional positions are required in order for the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) to provide critical support to the Let's Go CT Transportation ramp-up plan. A Pilot Expedited Transportation Investment Program is being implemented in the bridge reconstruction and replacement arena, where environmental permitting and the acquisition of private property are the critical elements that drive project delivery. Success of this, as well as other, Let's Go CT initiatives, depends on establishing a more responsive environmental permitting strategy. In addition to the funding for new staffing and consultant resources that have been accounted for in the FY 2017 budget for the Department of Transportation, ten (10) dedicated positions at the DEEP are essential. This is expected to have a minimal impact on DEEP's appropriated budget since a significant portion of the work performed could be funded by DOT's capital program.

Agency Title:	Inspection of RR Traffic Signals - Two positions
Agency Description:	Two additional positions are required in the Bureau of Highway Operations to perform annual comprehensive inspections of traffic signals with railroad pre-emption phasing, (as recommended by FRA Safety Advisory 2010-12) to enhance public safety by decreasing the risk potential (to railroad users and motoring public) for crashes due to malfunction. Two Design Engineer 2 positions will be responsible for comprehensive inspections of traffic control signal equipment, coordination with railroad offices to ensure that railroad personnel is present during the joint inspections, repairs of the traffic signal electronic equipment, preparation of inspection reports and recommendations for equipment upgrading/replacement for the approximately 100 signalized intersections with railroad pre-emption. These design engineers will also be responsible for signal equipment repairs on a 24-hour basis. In order to ensure safety during the inspections or repairs in proximity to the railroad right-of-way, two design engineers must be present during the equipment inspections or repairs at all times.  The scheduled inspection of railroad pre-emption systems has not been performed in the past. Due to the high number and complexity of the signalized intersections with railroad pre-emption, it has been determined that the recommended yearly inspections and necessary repairs will require two Design Engineer 2 employees working full-time.  Minimal state funds will be required, as FHWA has approved the obligation of federal funds for this purpose.  Of note, this item represents one of many federal safety recommendations/mandates that may require additional resources to implement.
