### REASON FOR REQUEST:

At the August 26, 2005 State Bond Commission meeting \$1,350,000 was allocated to provide grants-in-aid to Connecticut's acute care hospitals to finance physical plant modifications and renovations to enable the isolation of patients in the case of an infectious disease incident.

The purpose of this request is to change either the level of matching capital funds due to a change in the project scopes and to remove some institutions from the list of grant recipients. In addition, because this isolation capacity was critical to some of the hospitals' emergency preparedness, some institutions carried out these renovations at their own cost, in anticipation of these funds being made available in the future. Therefore, this request will also allow the Department of Public Health to reimburse those before mentioned hospitals for costs incurred on these projects to date.

As previously approved, funds will support the HEPA filtration and isolation rooms in hospital emergency department across the state that could provide interim care should the hospital see the state's first infectious patient. The grant will not exceed 50% of the total cost to the hospitals for these modifications and renovations.

This initiative will dramatically increase the number of hospital emergency beds with HEPA-filtered isolation capacity to approximately 200 beds statewide.

Section 31 of Special Act 67-381, as amended, provides that "a) The state bond commission may insure in the name of the state and may make advance commitments to insure any sums borrowed by the authority not exceeding in the aggregate fifteen million dollars for the purpose of providing working capital and organizational funds for the authority. In the event the state becomes liable as a result of default with respect to any such sums borrowed by the authority which were insured by the state, necessary payment shall be made by the state treasurer from funds appropriated for debt service. For the purposes of this section and of section 33 of special act 381 of 1967, as amended, organizational funds shall include, but shall not be limited to, cost of acquisition of private water companies having not more than four thousand five hundred service connections. Whatever sums are borrowed by the authority under the provisions of this section shall be repaid to the lender or lenders of the same on or before July 1, 2045. Whenever the authority applies to the state bond commission for insurance of borrowings to be insured by the state pursuant to this section, it shall submit to the state treasurer and the secretary of the state bond commission a financial plan evidencing the authority's ability to support such indebtedness.

(b) For the period during which any sums borrowed and insured in accordance with subsection (a) of this section are outstanding, the authority shall submit to the state treasurer a copy of its adopted budget for each fiscal year showing revenues adequate to meet all debt service payable by the authority during such fiscal year. Upon completion of the authority's annual audit for each fiscal year, the authority shall submit a copy thereof to the state treasurer."

The Authority will utilize the borrowings in order to permanently refinance \$598,000 of outstanding Working Capital and Organizational Fund Notes and \$900,000 of capital improvement projects as well as principal, interest and costs of issuance.

This guarantee by the State is contingent upon approval of the Authority's financing plan by the State Treasurer and the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management.
