Sec. 4-66g, grants-in-aid shall be provided to "any municipality which (1) is not economically distressed within the meaning of subsection (b) of section 32-9p of the general statutes, does not have an urban center in any plan adopted by the General Assembly pursuant to section 16a-30 of the general statutes, and is not a public investment community within the meaning of subdivision (9) of subsection (a) of section 7-545 of the general statutes and (2) has a population, as defined in subdivision (27) of section 10-262f of the general statutes, under thirty thousand. Such grants shall be used for purposes for which funds would be available under section 4-66c of the general statutes. No municipality may receive more than five hundred thousand dollars in one fiscal year under said program."

In accordance with Public Act 05-194 "a municipality that is (1) a distressed municipality within the meaning of subsection (b) of section 32-9p or a public investment community within the meaning of subdivision (9) of subsection (a) of section 7-545, and (2) otherwise eligible under this subsection for the Small Town Economic Assistance Program may elect to be eligible for said program in lieu of being eligible for financial assistance under section 4-66c, by a vote of its legislative body or, in the case of a municipality in which the legislative body is a town meeting, its board of selectmen, and submitting a written notice of such vote to the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management. Any such election shall be for the four-year period following submission of such notice to the secretary and may be extended for additional four-year periods in accordance with the same procedure for the initial election".

These funds are requested to provide a grant-in-aid to the Anderson Boys' Club for various capital improvements to their facility at 1037 East Main Street in Waterbury. The capital improvements will include the repair of the swimming pool which is currently closed and not operable.

The Anderson's Boys Club is a positive place for kids currently serving approximately 10% of the Waterbury School population with a membership of approximately 1600 members. The Club offers affordable membership fees which offer opportunities for children of all economic status. The Club is in the process of proposing a charter to offer memberships to girls as well as boys in September 2006. This change will allow the Club to change its name to Anderson Boys' and Girls' Club of Waterbury and expand enrollment and activities at the Club.

In accordance with Section 19 of S.A. 05-1, "...any grant-in-aid...which is made to any entity which is not a political subdivision of the state, the contract entered into pursuant to section 18 of this act shall provide that if the premises for which such grant-in-aid was made ceases, within ten years of the date of such grant, to be used as a facility for which such grant was made, an amount equal to the amount of such grant, minus ten per cent for each full year which has elapsed since the date of such grant, shall be repaid to the state and that a lien shall be placed on such land in favor of the state to ensure that such amount will be repaid in the event of such change in use, except that if the premises for which such grant-in-aid was made are owned by the State, a municipality or a housing authority, no lien need be placed."

Sections 3-21b and 3-21c, the State Treasurer has determined as follows: (1) the unexpended proceeds in such bond funds (including up to \$3,294,016.95 as of May 1, 2006 or any increase in that amount thereafter attributable to investment earnings) are no longer required for any of the purposes or projects funded or remaining to be funded from amounts in such bond funds; (2) \$2,761,858.62 of such expended proceeds (or together with any increase in that amount after May 1, 2006 attributable to investment earnings) may be transferred to the credit of the General Fund for the payment of debt service on general obligation bonds without adversely affecting the exclusion from gross income of the interest on the bonds from which such expended proceeds were derived; and (3) up to \$532,158.33 of such unexpended proceeds (or together with any increase in that amount after May 1, 2006 attributable to investment earnings) may be transferred to the credit of the Special Transportation Fund for the payment of debt service on general obligation bonds without adversely affecting the exclusion from gross income of the interest on the bonds from which such unexpended proceeds were derived. STATE REVOLVING FUND REFUNDING GENERAL REVENUE BONDS

REQUESTED: Authorization to issue and sell State Revolving Fund Refunding General Revenue Bonds of the State, Series 2006, in an amount not to exceed \$100,000,000; and the adoption of a Refunding Supplemental Resolution; and the authorization to use Interest Subsidy Fund bond proceeds in an amount not to exceed \$5,000,000 to provide the State match for the federal capitalization grants for the State's Drinking Water Program.

#### SUGGESTED RESOLUTION:

RESOLUTION OF THE STATE BOND COMMISSION AUTHORIZING (i) THE TREASURER TO ISSUE AND SELL AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$100,000,000 STATE REVOLVING FUND REFUNDING GENERAL REVENUE BONDS OF THE STATE, SERIES 2006, PURSUANT TO PUBLIC ACT NO. 86-420 OF THE FEBRUARY 1986 SESSION OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF CONNECTICUT, AS AMENDED; (ii) AND ADOPTING A SUPPLEMENTAL REFUNDING RESOLUTION; AND (iii) THE AUTHORIZATION TO USE INTEREST SUBSIDY FUND BOND PROCEEDS IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$5,000,000 TO PROVIDE THE STATE MATCH FOR THE FEDERAL CAPITALIZATION GRANTS FOR THE STATE'S DRINKING WATER PROGRAM.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE STATE BOND COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CONNECTICUT AS FOLLOWS:

Section. 1. In accordance with Public Act No. 86-420 of the February 1986 Session of the General Assembly of the State of Connecticut, as amended (the "Act"), the State Treasurer is hereby authorized to issue and sell State Revolving Fund Refunding General Revenue Bonds of the State (the "Bonds") authorized by this Commission to be issued in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$100,000,000. The Treasurer is delegated the authority to determine the terms and particulars of the Bonds, including any series designation or other action as may be considered necessary or desirable in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds, in accordance with the provisions of the resolution hereinafter mentioned.

Section 2. The Treasurer is authorized to sell such Bonds at public sale on sealed proposals or by negotiation, in such manner, at such price or prices, at such time or times, and on such terms and conditions as the Treasurer shall determine to be in the best interests of the State.

Section 3. Pursuant to the State Revolving Fund General Revenue Bond Program General Bond Resolution adopted on December 17, 2002 (the "General Resolution") and in accordance with Section 9 of the Act, the issuance of the Bonds shall be authorized by a Supplemental Resolution of the State containing the terms and conditions of their issuance and delivery. The Supplemental Resolution submitted to this Commission entitled "A Refunding Supplemental Resolution Authorizing the Issuance of \$100,000,000 State Revolving Fund Refunding General Revenue Bonds" (the "Refunding Supplemental Resolution") is hereby approved, with such changes, substitutions, deletions, additions or amendments as the Treasurer shall determine to be necessary or appropriate, in the best interest of the State and in accordance with the intent of its passage at this meeting, and any and all delegations of authority granted under the Refunding Supplemental Resolution to the Treasurer are hereby expressly ratified.

Section 4. The Treasurer is hereby further authorized to cause the preparation and distribution of a Preliminary Official Statement of the State for use in connection with the offering and sale of the Bonds. Upon the sale of the Bonds, the Treasurer shall prepare and distribute a final Official Statement and is hereby authorized to execute and deliver such Official Statement to the purchasers of the Bonds in the name and on behalf of the State.

Section 5. The Treasurer is hereby further authorized to use Interest Subsidy Fund bond proceeds in an amount not to exceed \$5,000,000 to provide the State match for the federal capitalization grants for the State's Drinking Water Program.

Section 6. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
