#### STATE TREASURER/OFFICE OF POLICY AND MANAGEMENT

NEXT STEPS SUPPORTIVE HOUSING INITIATIVE

REQUESTED: Authorization for the State Treasurer and the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management to enter into a contract assistance agreement to provide for state payment of debt service on bonds issued by the Connecticut Housing Finance Authority, not to exceed \$70,000,000

#### SUGGESTED RESOLUTION:

The State Bond Commission FINDS AND DETERMINES, that the issuance by the Connecticut Housing Finance Authority Mortgage Finance Program Revenue Bonds, in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$70,000,000, to fund the costs of mortgage loans sufficient to finance the development of 350 Supportive Housing Units, and the entry into such special needs housing loans is in the public interest and AUTHORIZES the Authority to issue such revenue bonds and enter into such special needs housing loans. The State Bond Commission also FINDS AND DETERMINES that pursuant to Section 17a-485c of the Connecticut General Statutes, as amended, the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management and the State Treasurer are authorized and directed to enter into a contract assistance agreement with the Authority, substantially in the form attached, with such further changes as such officers shall deem appropriate, in order to reduce the cost of borrowing by providing for payment of amounts of the actual debt service on such bonds, including principal, interest, interest rate swap payments, liquidity fees, letter of credit fees, trustee fees and other similar bond-related expenses, as certified to the State Treasurer by the Authority from time to time. The Authority is authorized to issue such bonds at public sale on sealed proposals or by negotiation, in such manner, at such price or prices, at such time or times and on such terms and conditions as the Authority shall determine to be in the best interests of the Authority. As provided in such contract assistance agreement, the form and terms of the bonds, and the form and terms of the sale of such bonds, shall be subject to the approval of the State Treasurer.

The Authority is authorized to enter into agreements on behalf of the Authority with respect to the issuance and sale of said bonds, including financial advisory agreements, bond purchase agreements, secondary market disclosure agreements, tax regulatory agreements and agreements with respect to the issuance, sale and securing of such bonds.

The Authority is authorized to determine the form, dates or dates, maturities of serial or term bonds, date and manner of sale, interest rate or rates and due dates thereof (including the issuance of such bonds at fixed rates or variable rates, and as capital appreciation or current interest bonds), the denominations and designation of such bonds, registration, conversion and transfer privileges, the term of redemption with or without premium, the priority and source of payment and all other terms and conditions of such bonds and of the issuance and sale thereof, as it shall determine to be in the best interests of the Authority.

The Authority is authorized to enter into such reimbursement agreements, remarketing agreements, standby bond purchase agreements, letter of credit or policies of bond insurance, interest rate swap agreements and other agreements for the purpose of moderating interest rate fluctuations and any other necessary or appropriate agreements in connection with obtaining any liquidity facility or credit facility with respect to such bonds, and to determine the terms and conditions of any such agreement.

#### STATE TREASURER

#### GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND SALE

REQUESTED: Authorization to issue and sell general obligation bonds of the State in an amount not to exceed \$435,000,000

#### SUGGESTED RESOLUTION:

The State Treasurer is authorized to issue and sell general obligation bonds of the State, which were previously authorized to be issued by this Commission, or which may be authorized to be issued by this Commission prior to their sale, in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$435,000,000. The bonds may be issued in such form and manner that the interest thereon may be includable in or excludable from the gross income of the owners thereof for Federal income tax purposes. It is hereby found to be in the public interest if any such bonds are issued so that the interest thereon is includable in the gross income of the owners thereof.

The Treasurer is authorized to consolidate for sale bonds authorized to be issued under two or more bond acts and issue the same as one or more bond issues provided that a separate maturity schedule for the bonds authorized under each bond act shall be established and filed with the Secretary of the State Bond Commission prior to the delivery of the bonds. The Treasurer is authorized to sell such bonds at public sale on sealed proposals or by negotiation, in such manner, at such price or prices, at such time or times, and on such terms and conditions as the Treasurer shall determine to be in the best interests of the State.

The Treasurer is authorized to enter into agreements on behalf of the State with respect to the issuance and sale of said bonds, including financial advisory agreements, bond purchase agreements, secondary market disclosure agreements, tax regulatory agreements, which may contain the provisions set forth in Section 3–20(r) of the Connecticut General Statutes if applicable, and agreements with respect to the issuance, sale and securing of such bonds.

The Treasurer is authorized to determine the form, date or dates, maturities of serial or term bonds, date and manner of sale, interest rate or rates and due dates thereof (including the issuance of such bonds at fixed rates or variable rates, and as capital appreciation or current interest bonds), the denominations and designation of such bonds, registration, conversion and transfer privileges, the terms of redemption with or without premium, and all other terms and conditions of such bonds and of the issuance and sale thereof, as she shall determine to be in the best interests of the State, provided that she shall file a certificate of determination with the Secretary of the State Bond Commission on or before the date of delivery of such bonds setting forth the details and particulars of such bonds determined by her in accordance with this delegation.

The Treasurer is authorized to enter into on behalf of the State such reimbursement agreements, remarketing agreements, standby bond purchase agreements and any other necessary or appropriate agreements in connection with obtaining any liquidity facility or credit facility with respect to such bonds, and to determine the terms and conditions of any such agreement. The Treasurer may pledge the full faith and credit of the State to the State's payment obligations under any such agreement.

The Treasurer is authorized to enter into on behalf of the State such swap or other contracts with respect to such bonds and any other necessary or appropriate agreements in connection with obtaining any such contract, with such terms and conditions and parties as the Treasurer may determine, as provided in and subject to the requirements of Section 3–20a(c) of the Connecticut General Statutes. The Treasurer is authorized to pledge the full faith and credit of the State to the State's payment obligations under any such contract.
