Dear Comptroller Wyman:

The following information on the State's General Fund for Fiscal Year 2007-2008 is provided in accordance with Section 4-66 of the General Statutes. In addition, an analysis of the Special Transportation Fund is included due to the significant nature of this fund. Estimates are as of May 31, 2008. The General Fund is now projected to have a deficit of \$19.7 million, a decrease of \$20.4 million over the original enacted budget. This represents a \$33.2 million improvement in the estimated deficit since last month.

Over the last several weeks, Governor Rell has instituted a hiring freeze and demanded that Executive branch agencies curtail expenditures. General Fund expenditure requirements have been reduced by \$26.1 million since last month. On June 16th, Governor Rell signed the deficiency bill for FY'08 which redirected \$41.47 million in necessary funding through various appropriation transfers and reductions. After factoring in these transfers, projected lapses in various state agency accounts are still \$117.6 million.

This month's letter includes several adjustments to our revenue projections which result in an overall increase of \$10.7 million in the General Fund. The primary driver of this revision is an increase in federal grant revenue due primarily to the expectation that \$30.0 million, which was part of \$82.5 million in fiscal year 2008 revenue previously thought to be delayed into fiscal year 2009, will now actually be received in fiscal year 2008, as well as an additional \$22.0 million due to a reforecast. Unfortunately, this positive news was offset by a \$40.0 million reduction in the Personal Income Tax forecast due exclusively to weakening trends in the withholding component of that tax. The June 15th estimated Income Tax payments are currently on target, with several more significant collection days yet to be tallied. All other revenue changes net to a negative \$1 million.

These projections reflect legislative action to transfer FY'08 funds into FY'09 to pay for the Criminal Justice Reform bill (P.A. 08-1, January Special Session).

In the Special Transportation Fund, revenues have been revised downward by \$11.0 million due primarily to lower License, Permit, and Fee revenue of \$7.0 million and lower interest earnings of \$2.5 million. Partially offsetting this reduction is an increase in identified lapses of \$7.5 million.

Similar to last month's letter, we are still projecting that the second year of the biennium, FY'09, is approximately \$150 million in deficit. Governor Rell is now working on adjustments to bring FY'09 back into balance.

It should be noted that while these projections are the best that can be made at this time, estimates may have to be adjusted to reflect changes in the economy, expenditure patterns and/or other factors.
