- Lt. Governor Rell called the meeting to order at 1:00 P.M.
- 1. It was voted to approve the minutes of the meeting of February 5, 2004.
- 2. The following new transactions were approved by the Committee:
- FAC 2004-10 Department of Administrative Services A transfer of a total of \$1,600,000.00; \$995,557.00 from Workers' Compensation Claims Account and \$604,443.00 from Personal Services Account to Other Expenses to meet the requirements of the Spend Management program for Fiscal Year 2003-04.
- FAC 2004-11 Division of Criminal Justice –A transfer of \$120,000.00 from the Witness Protection account to the Forensic Sex Evidence Exams account to cover estimated expenses which will exceed current appropriation.
- FAC 2004-12 Department of Consumer Protection A transfer of \$250,000.00 from Personal Services; \$200,000.00 to Equipment and \$50,000.00 to Other Expenses to convert its local area network from Token Ring to Ethernet Technology.

- FAC 2004-13 Department of Public Health -- A transfer of \$278,000.00 from Medicaid Administration to X-ray Screening and Tuberculosis Care to meet obligations.
- FAC 2004-14 Department of Education -- A transfer of a total of \$1,850,000.00 from the Magnet School Grant; \$1,000,000 to Personal Services and \$700,000 to Other Expenses; \$150,000.00 from Repair of Instructional Equipment to the Textbook/Media Account to meet personnel, related other expenses and textbook costs for the vocational-technical high school system.
- FAC 2004-15 Department of Social Services -- A transfer of \$12,000,000.00 from Child Care Services-TANF-CCDBG to SAGA in order to meet anticipated cash requirements.
